—Chatham World: Although the catch of smelts has been small here it was pretty good down river and excellent at Tabusintac and other gullies along the coast. Fish from along the shore have been brought here and swelled the shipments from this place to a respectable figure. The shipments of fresh fish for December were 45 carloads, about 450 tons. A. & R. Loggie shipped 210 tons and other large shippers are F. W. Russel, Loggie & Burr and W. S. Loggie. These shipments were not all smelts, however. Besides many carloads of fish from the freezers, there are a good many carloads of tomcods of little value.
