The horse races advertised to take place at Buctouche Bay, Friday, had to be given up on account of the weakness of the ice. The entertainment given in St. Patrick's Hall, last Saturday evening, will probably be reproduced in Kingston and Buctouche. An Ottawa despatch to the St. John Globe says that Kennedy F. Burns is to be called to the Senate almost immediately. The writ for a new election in Gloucester will be issued as soon as Burns says things are ready. Messrs. Alexander Murray and Robert Lawson were around Monday, soliciting subscriptions for the stock of the proposed creamery. The building will be located on Mr. Alexander Robertson's farm above Kingston. The school inspectors report a very hard winter in which to do their work. Storm upon storm, attended with high winds and cold weather, have rendered the country roads impassable for days at a time.—Educational Review. Wm. Wyse, Game Warden, seized a lot of moose meat, which he found in possession of Joseph and John Rigley, of Black River, Friday morning, and will take proceedings against them. The fine is \$50 to \$200, for each offence.—World. The Women's Missionary Auxillary will hold a public Easter Thankoffering entertainment, consisting of music, recitations, readings, &c., in the Wesley Memorial church, Harcourt, on Friday evening the 23rd. Lord Clyde is not unknown here as he travelled in this county two seasons, and his stock can be seen. Twenty men and a dozen horses are employed on the South Beach with mud diggers and shovels, digging the Barque Valona out of the sand. They expect to get her off with the high tides this week. River Hebert notes announce that a young man named Bets, of Harcourt Station, working in the woods at Shulee, cut one foot badly, got cold in the wound and had to have three toes amputated. His foot was saved with difficulty. He is now doing well.
