Sad Drowning Accident at Cocagne.

One of the saddest drowning accidents known in this vicinity for years, occurred in front of the Casey Cape light-house, at Cocagne, on Friday, 6th inst., when Pilot Eustache Hebert, a middle aged man and father of a large and helpless family, met with a sudden and unexpected death. The unfortunate man left home immediately after dinner with the intention of shooting wild geese, but finding little game along the shore, he at length decided, unaccompanied, to venture out among the breakers in his frail skiff. This thoughtless decision cost him his life. As may readily be imagined, the coast at this point, from the fact of bordering directly on the straits, is always rough in the spring of the year, huge and countless cakes of ice being continually in motion from the never-ending surge that prevails. Deceased was nevertheless an expert boatman, and being attracted by several flocks of ducks and brant that skimmed the waves, he was foolish enough to embark. When about half a mile out he was seen by parties standing on the shore, suddenly to rest his oars, to stand erect and to fire. Witnesses say they saw the smoke and heard the report of the gun, but a flurry of snow having sprung up the moment the report was heard, it is not known for certain whether Hebert was thrown into the water by the recoil of the gun or by the upsetting of his dory. The only boat within reach was locked up in the light-house shed, but two or three hundred yards distant, but in answer to the shouts of the drowning man this was soon launched, manned and put under way. His cries for help were audible to the rescuing party until nearly within reach. Then they ceased to be heard, and when the anxious men at last gained the scene of the accident, all that remained to tell the tale was the up-turned skiff, the right-hand mitten of the unfortunate man clutched firmly to its gunwale, his pipe, hat and powder-horn floating upon the water. The painter was wrapped four times round the boat proving that she had been overturned just so many times by the helpless and benumbed man in his frantic struggle for life. Searching parties were organized at once, and although they continued grappling until late the same night, their labors were not crowned until Saturday noon. The funeral was largely attended. It is understood that a collection is to be taken in the near future for the benefit of the now fatherless family, which laudable action it is unnecessary to say will be warmly assisted by all.

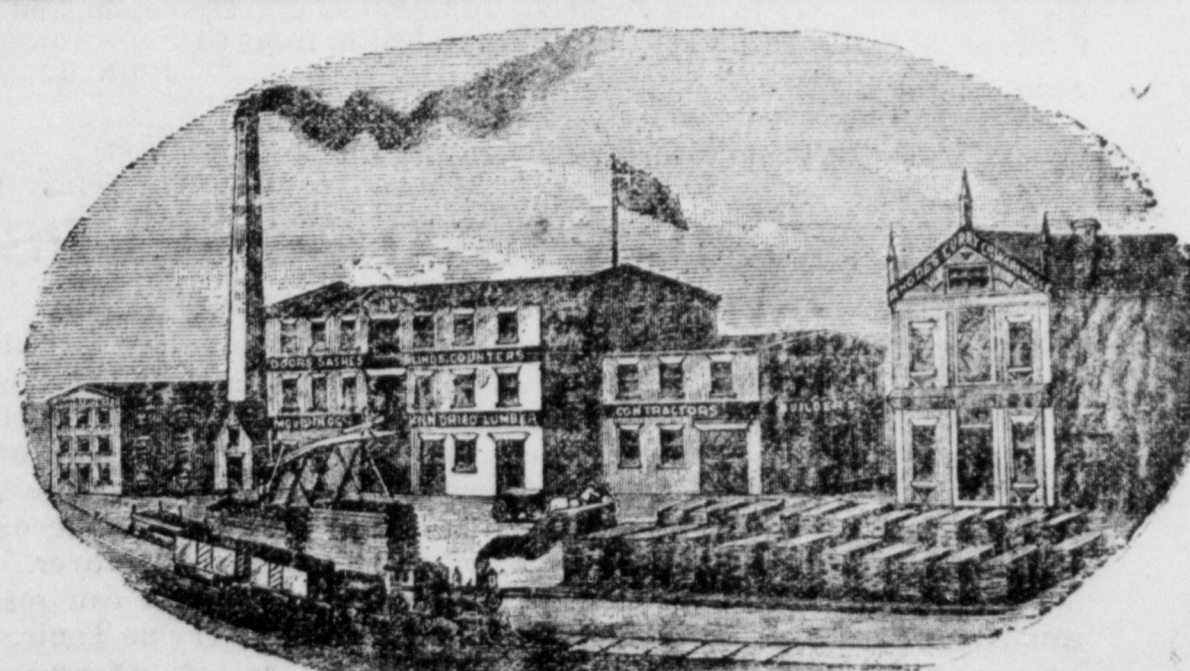
