Anything unusual in the growth of the plant requires kind and nature of the soil.

> This record of the potatoes must extend over four or five years. This continuous record is valuable as showing the average quality of any particular plant. It will be found that some of the plants will have a wonderful record the first year, but they will die out and prove worthless. Others will begin small and increase as the years go by.

> In the fall the tubers should be dug, selecting only the finest hills on the ground for a continuation of the experiment. Place these tubers in seperate boxes, numbered and labelled. They should be used for seed the next spring. At the end of five years the records of the potatoes will tell whether any improvements have been made. Often a new variety that is specially adapted to the particular soil will be






