

GENERAL NEWS.

Nineteen years ago fifty tons of rock fell in an open pit at Tilly Foster mine, Brown's, N. Y., killing six miners and maiming three others for life.

Capt. MacFarlan, of the steamer Hawkburn, which has just arrived at Galveston, Texas, from Rio Janeiro, states that while he was in Rio Janeiro there were 150 deaths a day from small-pox, and the inhabitants were panic-stricken.

Brakeman William H. Kiehnmeister was instantly killed Thursday afternoon while at work in the Ontario and Western railroad yard in Middletown, N. Y.

At the annual meeting of the Acadia Sugar Refining Company a total dividend of nine per cent. on preference stock was declared for the past year.

Decision given at Halifax in the matter of the collision of the steamer Miramichi and schooner Osceola on August 14, on the Miramichi river, adjudges that Capt. DeGrace, of the steamer, was not on deck when he should be, that he left the steamer in incompetent hands and that he did not stop after the accident to ascertain if assistance was required.

The Montreal Knights of labor have decided to secede from the United States order and form an independent Canadian branch.

John Cooper, aged fifteen, was guiding "stuck" hogs from a chute into a vat of boiling water, at the Davies pork packing establishment, Toronto, when one carcass struck him and hurled him headlong into the vat.

Two women quarrelled in Chicago. One was so much affected that she died of remorse, and the other is so prostrate that it is feared she will lose her reason.

Rev. Jonathan Brown, 80 years old, a retired member of the Congregational church, Amesbury, Mass., was burned to death on Thanksgiving Day.

R. A. Chapman, of Moncton, is returning officer for the Westmorland Scott Act election on January 6.

Rev. John Read, of the Wesley Memorial church, Moncton, has been invited to Centenary church, St. John.

At Philadelphia on Saturday H. H. Holmes was refused a new trial and was sentenced to death for the murder of Benjamin F. Pitzel.

Rev. A. F. Brown, late of Havelock, is to take charge of the Campbellton Baptist church.

The collectors at the leading ports have been instructed to send daily to the department the returns of entries made.

The department of marine has been looking into the matter of the winter shipment of cattle from St. John.

The official analysis of the Dominion analyzed 225 samples of foods, drugs, and fertilizers during the past year.

Four persons were drowned in the Mougha river below Barnesville, Pa., Saturday night. Jas. Pykup, Miss Laura Stevenson and Mr. and Mrs. Ford were returning from Barnesville to their homes in a skiff.

At a crossing on the Lake Shore railway in Toledo, Saturday night, a Detroit express ran into a vehicle containing three persons, all of whom were killed.

Murderer Orville Eales, while resisting arrest by a posse at Cythiana, Ky., on Sunday, was shot to death after he had butchered his wife, killed an officer and badly wounded two other men.

About 500 deaths are reported as having resulted from the severe storms which have prevailed recently in the vicinity of Odessa, Russia.

The Hyams murder case, the longest in point of time in the annals of criminal trials in Canada, ended at Toronto on Saturday with a verdict of acquittal for the twins.
