**Erastus Wiman's Case.**

NEW YORK, March 16.—Erastus Wiman is now to all intents and purposes a free man. The people may appeal to the Court of Appeals or they may take a new trial, or they may drop the whole business. But if they should appeal to the Court of Appeals and the latter court should support the reversal of judgment, that would end the case forever. The case was a long and trying one for the District Attorney. To decide to take a new trial the whole business will have to be gone over again with the chances of, as in all new trials, the prosecution not doing as well in the second trial as in the first. This is the opinion among lawyers, and they said still further, that the argument of Judge Van Brunt in general terms would be sustained by the higher court should an appeal be taken. Consequently it was generally believed that the people would let the case rest where it is.

Wiman had been sentenced to five years and six months in State prison for forging a \$2,000 check.

Judge Van Brunt held that Wiman was a member of the firm and that the withdrawal of funds from the assets of the firm for his own purposes did not constitute a criminal offence. He said it was abundantly shown that Dun was aware of the overdrafts.
