PINEAPPLE PUDDING.—Butter a pudding dish, and line the sides with slices of stale sponge cake. Pare and cut a pineapple into thin slices, rejecting the woody core.

FRUIT PUDDING.—Take one quart of cake crumbs, and mix with a custard made of three cupfuls of milk, four eggs, one spoonful of sugar, and nutmeg to taste; let this stand half an hour, then stir in half a cupful of well-washed currants, one cupful of stoned raisins, and a few strips of citron.

LEMON PUDDING.—For this pudding there are required: Two cupfuls of milk, a dessertspoonful of butter, half a cupful of sugar, half a cupful of ground rice, the grated rind and juice of one lemon, three eggs.

BAKED RICE.—Pick and thoroughly wash one cupful of rice; put it into a dish that will hold two quarts and a pint, and cover with sweet milk; add two teaspoonfuls of salt, one tablespoonful of ground cinnamon and four tablespoonfuls of sugar.

CABINET PUDDING.—Butter a melon mould, and decorate it with candied fruit, or with raisins boiled till soft and seeded; then put in a layer of lady fingers, or stale sponge cake, then a few pieces of fruit, and repeat till the mould is nearly full.

APRICOTS A LA NEIGE.—Boil one cupful of rice fifteen minutes. Wring small pudding-cloths, one-third of a yard square out of hot water, and lay them over a small half-pint bowl. Spread the rice one-third of an inch thick over the cloth. Put an apricot in the centre, filling the cavity in each half apricot with rice.

FARINA PUDDING.—For this pudding there are needed: One quart milk, four heaping tablespoonfuls of farina previously soaked in a little cold water for one hour, one tablespoonful of butter, one teaspoonful of salt, two eggs.
