The trade returns for the six months of the fiscal year ending 31st December give the following comparative result: Exports were valued at \$92,599,132, a decrease of \$4,905,258 as compared with the corresponding period of last year. The imports decreased \$6,321,667, the total value being \$54,572,395. The duty collected amounted to \$8,701,038, as against \$10,193,562. December shows a greater falling off in exports than any month for some time past, the decrease being \$2,500,000. The imports for the month increased about 300,000.
