Jessie Keith's Murderer Sentenced.

STRAFORD, Ont., March 29.—A quick trial and a short shift was the fate of Almedee Chatelle, the murderer of Jessie Keith, who was sentenced to be hanged on May 31.

There was no defence; in fact the prisoner helped the crown considerably to put the noose round his own neck. At 10 o'clock the trial commenced, and after the evidence given was heard, the Judge at 4 o'clock addressed the jury and they retired at 4.30. In ten minutes a verdict of guilty was returned. Chatelle was then sentenced to be hanged.

When the evidence had all been put in, Chatelle was given an opportunity to speak and addressed the Court in this meaningless fashion.

"I have a secret which I will give if the Court wishes to hear it. The subject is to go according to the Gospel. Any more information is to your own knowledge. Can give better developments later than at the present time. Such was the Kingdom of Heaven in the first place, and in the second place, a corruptible church. This is as far as I will go."

When asked by the Judge if he had anything further to say, the prisoner continued thus, "Nothing, except that I am pleased with the Court as far as it has gone, but would rather not open the case unless insisted upon. My complaints are that there will be objects added or diminished. Further than that there will be nothing in it."

Being once more requested by His Lordship to address himself to the jury, he added: "I throw myself into their tender mercy and care."

Chief Justice Armour in a half hour's address reviewed the evidence very carefully, and explained to the jury their duty in the case. His Lordship made no reference whatever to the possibility of the prisoner's insanity. When the verdict was announced the scene which followed was to a degree dramatic. Hideoous as was the prisoner's crime, and void of all feeling as Chatelle appeared to be, His Lordship was affected in passing sentence and his hands trembled visibly as he began his remarks to the prisoner. Chatelle received the verdict with an air of bravado, and

when foreman William Gordon announced the verdict of guilty, he exclaimed "That settles it." Asked if he had anything to say why sentence should not be passed upon him, Chatelle arose in the prisoner's box, and, throwing up both his hands and shaking his head, announced in a full, clear voice, and without a tremor: "Thanks, I have nothing to say." His Lordship then pronounced sentence.

As the Judge, in concluding, said: "May the Lord have mercy on your soul," Chatelle replied: "Correct, sir," with an expression flitting across his face that seemed to indicate a dawning realization of the dreadful position.

Virtues of Hot Water.
"If I were asked what women's best friend is," said the doctor thoughtfully, in the New York World, "I should say hot water. If she drinks hot water flavored with lemon and sweetened with sugar when she has been out in the cold she will ward off chills. The same agreeable medicine taken early enough in the progress of a cold will stop it. When nervous headache makes the forehead throb and the back and neck ache, hot water will relieve the pain. For tired eyes, inflamed eyelids and styes," continued the doctor, "nothing is so good as hot water. The eyes should be sooped with a cloth dipped in boiling water. Sprains may be relieved greatly by soaking the afflicted member in hot water for half an hour at a time and then binding it with a flannel bandage. Bruises yield to much the same treatment although such long soaking is unnecessary. Wounds and sores may be treated by pouring hot water on them for a few minutes at a time. Very hot water applied to a bleeding cut will stop the flow of blood frequently. Then for mere comfort," she went on, "few things equal hot water. A rubber bag full of it makes one indifferent to cold. Wrapped in flannel and put on the floor of a carriage it is invaluable. She who suffers from cold feet at night has but to fill a hot water bag to know what comfort is. Sufferers from sleeplessness find themselves deliciously drowsy after a hot bath. Wrinkles flee before it, and blackheads vanish before its constant use. Great is hot water."
