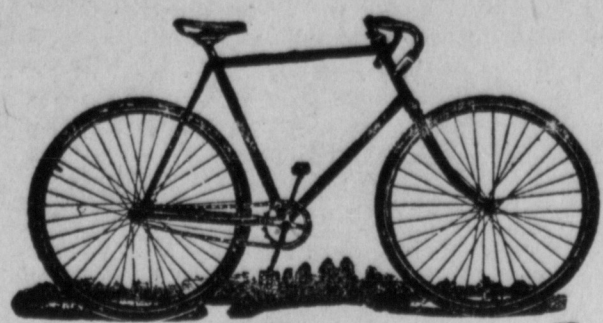

Sunday School Notes.

Supts., your parish president has already sent you a "return" sheet to fill and return to him. Will you kindly attend to it early so that the parish officer can get his "report" in to me by May 15th. We want every school in the County to make a full report and a careful one.

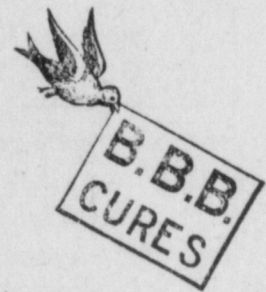

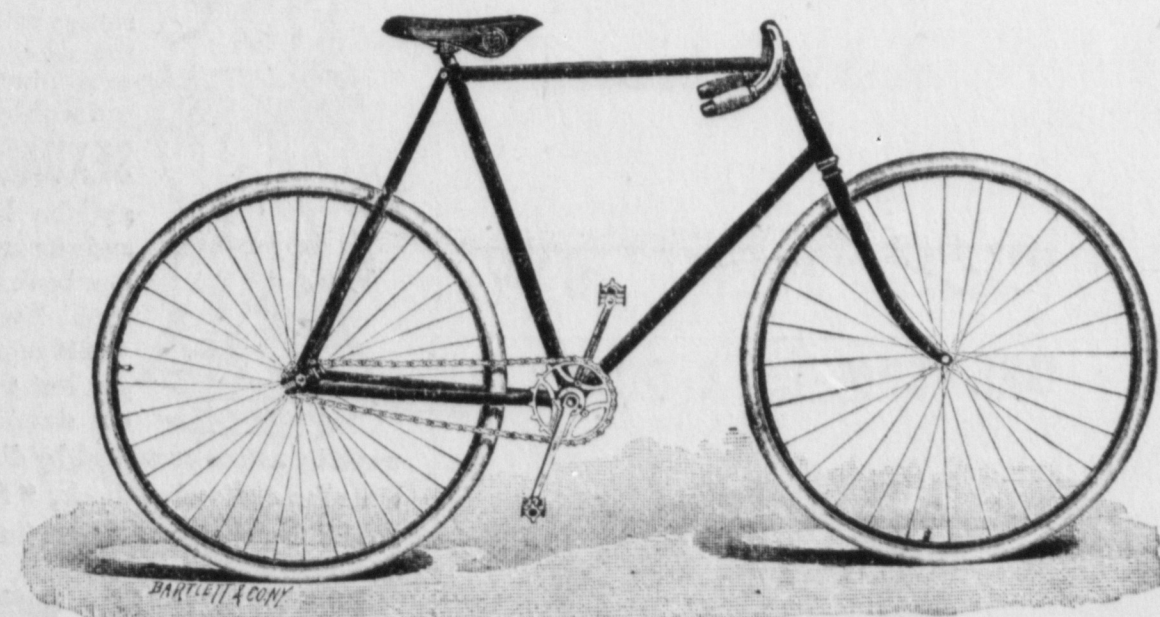
