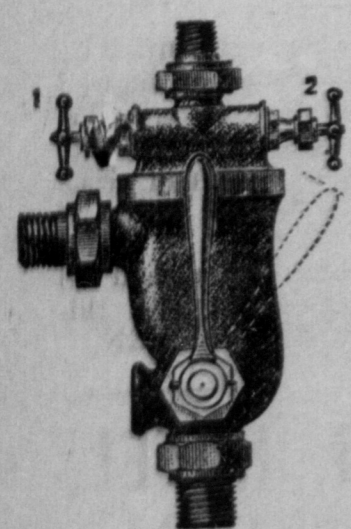

THE WIDE WIDE WORLD.

On account of the excessive demands made by King Meusek, it is improbable that peace will be concluded between Italy and Abyssinia.

It is reported from Havana that two columns of Spanish troops, mutually mistaking each other for insurgents, opened fire, with serious loss of life.

Rev. Peter Haverman, of Troy, N. Y. who celebrated his ninetieth birthday anniversary last week, is said to be the oldest Roman Catholic priest in America.

These are the figures taken from one large liquor-shop in London on a Saturday afternoon: There entered the place 4,250 men, 2,442 women, 1,120 children and 369 babies.

Many Canadian hares are soon to be turned loose in the woods of Sandwich township, Mass., which is on Buzzard's Bay. Sportsmen of that region are arranging to secure the hares and turn them down, in the hope of stocking the woods with them, for game purposes.

GLoucester, Mass, March, 26.—James Sterling, one of the crew of the schooner Davy Crockett, which returned this morning from the Georges, was informed today by an attorney that he has been left \$25,000 as his portion of the estate of his grandfather, who died near Belfast Ireland. Sterling's sister, who lives in South Boston, is the only other heir.

The Atlantic negro ascensionists, called locally "flyaway negroes," who expected to be taken up to heaven on last March 6 and gave away most of their possessions in anticipation of the event, have received notification from somewhere that the flight has been postponed for seven years. Many of them are in pretty severe straits as a result of the completeness of their faith.

Twenty-one of the Presidents of the United States are dead. They all lie buried in nine States. Virginia holds five—Washington at Mt. Vernon, Thos. Jefferson at Monticello, James Madison at Montpelier, and James Monroe and John Tyler at Richmond. In New York lies Van Buren and Kinderhook, Fillmore at Buffalo, Grant at Riverside Park, and Arthur at Albany. In Ohio are William Henry Harrison at North Bend, Hayes at Columbus, and Garfield at Cleveland. In Tennessee are Andrew Jackson near Nashville, Polk at Nashville and Andrew Johnson at Greenville. The two Adams are buried at Quincy, Mass., and Taylor, Pierce, Buchanan and Lincoln are buried respectively at Louisville, Ky., Concord, N. H., Lancaster, Penn., and Springfield, Ill.
