Failures in Canada and the United States.

There is nothing that will prove more clearly the position of a country than its business failures. In the year ending 30th June, 1874, the last year that the Conservative party was responsible to the country prior to 1878 the failures amounted to seven and a half million dollars. In 1875, the very first year under Reform rule, the failures reached the highest amount in the history of the country, twenty-eight and a half million dollars, nearly four times as much as the year before. The lowest amount in any year during their regime was twenty-four millions and a half, and the average under Reform administration was twenty-six and a half million dollars. In 1880, the first year in which the beneficial effect of the National Policy, inaugurated by the Conservative party, was felt, confidence was again restored in the country, and the failures were reduced to eight million dollars. Since that time, although Canada in common with other countries, has passed through a season of the greatest commercial depression the world has ever known, the average amount of the failures for the fifteen years has been only thirteen million dollars, as against an average of twenty-six and a half million dollars during the period in which the country was under Reform Government. In this, as in every other branch of the statistical records of the country, there is indisputable evidence that the policy of the Reform party was ruinously detrimental to the best interests of the country.

A similar result may be seen in the United States, where the two great political parties are divided on much the same lines as regards their commercial policy as the Conservatives and Reformers in this country. In making the comparison it should be remembered that the policy of the Democratic party is Free Trade and tariff for revenue only, the same as that of the Reform party here. They made great promises before the election of 1892, just as the Reform party of this country did in 1873, and much was expected of them. They were elected on the strength of the benefits that were anticipated from the policy they had promised to bring into effect, being in this respect in exactly the same position as the Reform Government of 1874-78. The result was the same there as here. The failures amounted to only one hundred and eight and a half million dollars in 1892, and the very first year the Democratic party, the party of free trade and tariff for revenue only were in power, the failures increased to four hundred and two and a half million dollars. There as in Canada, under a free trade and tariff for revenue Government, in the first year after the affairs of the country came under their control, the failures increased to four times as much as they were the year previous. The people of the United States followed the same course as we in this country did in 1878; they took the first opportunity to elect a Republican majority in favor of protection, to Congress and to the Senate. Confidence was again restored there as in Canada in 1878, and the number of failures was immediately reduced and now amounts to no more than they did previous to the change above noted.
