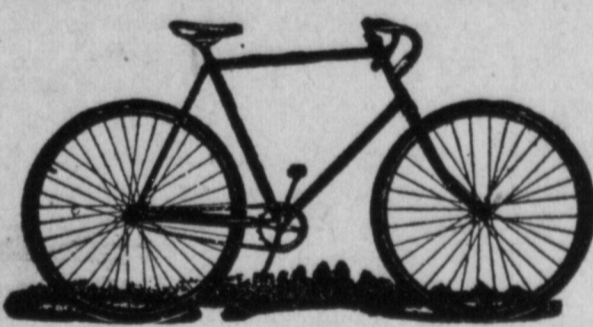

THE WIDE, WIDE WORLD.

A message received from Pretoria says that the Transvaal government have decided to reconsider the heavy fines and imprisonment which the sentences propose to inflict upon the captured reformers, but that it will maintain the term of the banishment of the reformers.

Ties piled by tramps or train robbers on the Chicago, Milwaukee & St. Paul railway at Waldo, a few miles north of Milwaukee derailed the south bound freight train last night killing three men, the engineer, a brakeman and a tramp. Two were injured. The engine and seven cars were demolished.

Smithson, a mining town on the Baltimore and Ohio railroad about 40 miles east of Pittsburgh, Pa., was visited by a windstorm and cloudburst yesterday afternoon. The mines of the Waverly Coal Co. were badly flooded. One hundred miners who were working in the mines were compelled to flee for their lives. The loss is estimated at between \$50,000 and \$75,000.

A terrific hail storm visited Lebanon, Mo., and vicinity last Friday night, accompanied by wind. It was the most destructive storm ever known here. The hail fell thick and fast and the rain came down in torrents. The hail was terrific and very destructive throughout the country. Windows in nearly every residence and house were riddled. There are probably 3000 broken windows in the town.

Sixty-eight Marriages at One Time.
A curious custom obtains in the little town of Plougastell, in Brittany, namely, the collecting of all the marriages of the year into one great event. At a recent ceremony of this kind thirty-four couples were married simultaneously.

A Bony Growth
A practical test of the cathode rays has been made upon a Toledo patient within the past week, and by this method a physical cause for serious mental infirmity in young Miss Miller has been discovered. Furthermore, the X rays have developed the fact beyond question that a delicate, yet possible surgical operation will remove the physical deformity and restore completely and permanently the reason of the patient.

The patient afflicted is a young lady of far more than common beauty, of more

than ordinary refinement, and at times of great intelligence, but she has shown such a decided predilection for members of the opposite sex that no one who knew her had any doubt that something was radically wrong with her mental faculties.

This mania has manifested itself in lavish attentions to men who had given her no possible encouragement, and many of whom were in no position to do so. Her relatives were very much mortified, and many skilled physicians consulted, and in order that relief or cure might be found, but the case baffled them.

In final desperation the parents had the girl's head subjected to the influence of the cathode rays, when it was discovered that the under side of a portion of her skull was covered with bony growths, similar in appearance to a series of buttons, which press down upon the brain and cause pain as well as the mental trouble.

Skilled surgeons were called in council, and it was their almost unanimous verdict that when this growth and the consequent pressure is removed the young woman will be herself again. It has been determined, it is said, to perform the operation as it is believed that it can be done successfully without danger to the health or life of the patient.

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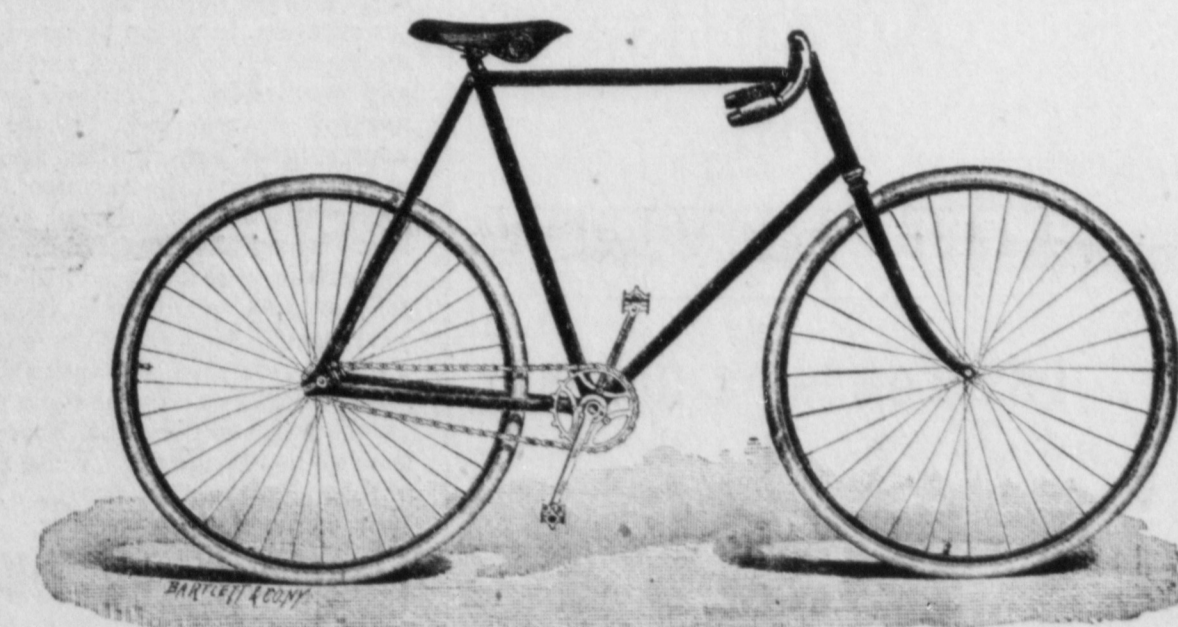
