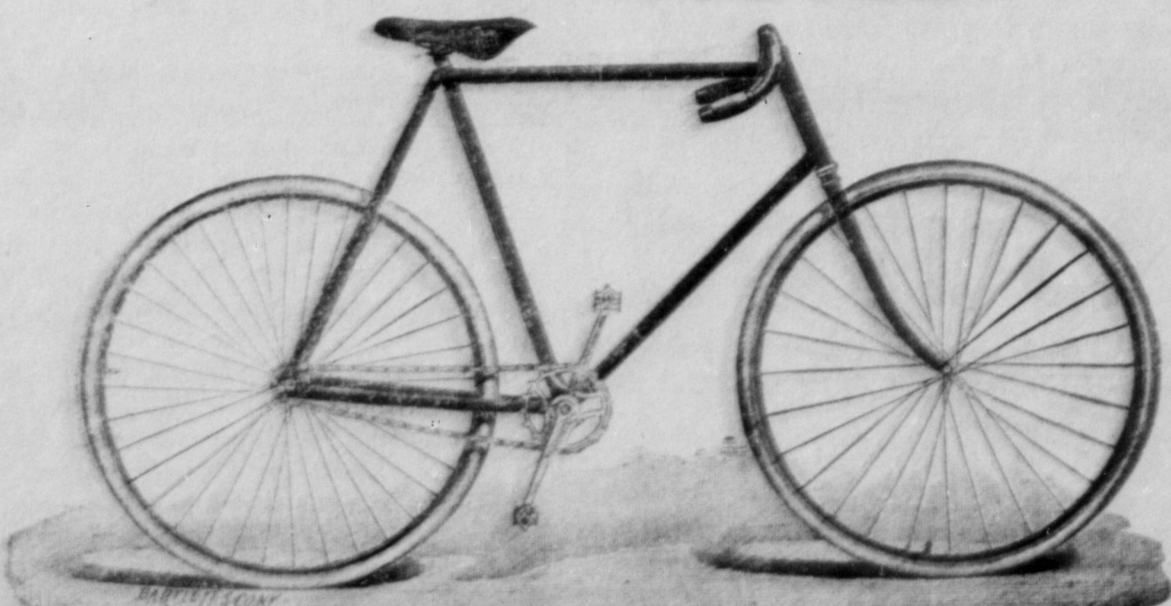

We note that the Orangemen of Westmorland have resolved to take no action as a body in regard to the election in that county. This would seem to indicate that there is one ultra-Protestant body which does not fit the remedial bill so very objectionable as some do. Their moderation is more commendable than the partisanship of those sectarians on both sides who are either more Catholic than the Pope or more Protestant than Luther. In a country such as ours, made up of differing races and creeds, our best hopes for peace and concord rest upon our moderate men, whether in high position or as mere voters at the polls. This country has no use for extremists.

The silver question is an issue in United States politics even more disturbing than the remedial bill is in Ontario. Present indications are that a tidal wave is sweeping over the western and southern states in favor of "free silver." There are millions of money behind this campaign, and it now seems likely that the Democratic national convention will nominate a silverite candidate for the presidency. It is even doubtful whether the Republican party will in its platform squarely oppose free silver, though it is expected to do so, and to name McKinley, of tariff fame, as its candidate. With so strong a man as its standard bearer and a "sound money" platform Republican chances of winning the fight ought to be excellent.

There is one important argument put forward on behalf of the government of Canada which we have not found answered or any attempt at any answer being made. It is this: The government of Canada is responsible for its trade policy, its tariff and its banking system. Now in the recent commercial panic in the United States South America and Australia, not to mention the old world, when banks were tumbling down and commercial houses failing by the hundred, Canada was less disturbed financially than any other part of the world. This certainly redounds to the credit of our government, and the opposition seem compelled to silently admit the fact. At least they do not attempt to controvert it. The question naturally arises, would the new order of things proposed to be introduced by the Liberals, if they came into power, increase the existing stability of our affairs or lessen it? There is food for thought in this.

The active way in which Messrs. Mowat, Greenway, Blair and Fielding, premiers, and a number of their colleagues are interfering in the dominion elections serves to recall the time when it was the declared policy of the Liberals to hold provincial and federal politics strictly apart. But it is only natural that the party should change this part of its policy with its changing ideas of the tariff and trade questions. The "unrestricted" party will not be restricted in any way.

Lord Dufferin is at length to retire from the diplomatic service. He is now an old man. In his latest post of ambassador to Paris he is to be succeeded by Lord Llandaff.

Father Richard of Rogersville Interviewed.

Father Richard gave the following answer to a canvasser the other day:—  
"I am a Roman Catholic Priest, and as such I am in duty bound to preach and show respect and obedience for law and the constitution. I am a citizen of the Dominion and a British Subject; as such I must give an example of loyalty for the laws of my country and show due regard for the wishes of Her Majesty the Queen uphold Her royal engagements and the decrees of the highest tribunal of Her Empire.

"Therefore, my duty in the present crisis, seems clear and evident; I will support the present Federal Government as representing these principles. I cannot see how any loyal subject of Her Majesty; any lover of his country and fellowman can act otherwise. To be or not to be, that is the question." All other minor questions agitated in the Country which tend to lead the electors aside from the great issues in the pending election, appear to me inopportune and injurious to the best interests of the community. A noble example of fidelity to duty and loyalty to a sacred trust is given by the Roman Catholic Episcopate of the Dominion of Canada. For the sake of principle and respect for law and the constitution, the Bishops direct their subjects to follow 'Tupper,' a Protestant, rather than 'Laurier,' a Catholic, not because one is Conservative and the other Liberal; but because the former upholds the rights of minorities, guaranteed by the constitution, whilst the latter is on record as opposing that policy. This is well worthy of notice and of imitation."
