THE WIDE, WIDE WORLD.

Schooner John E. McKenzie, at Gloucester from Grand Banks, reports the loss of William Cary and Thos. Fraser, members of the crew, by the capsizing of a dory while attending trawls. Both men were natives of Nova Scotia. Fraser leaves a wife and three children in Gloucester.

A new outbreak of natives of Matabeland has occurred between Umtali and Salisbury. At a meeting in that vicinity on June 9, of a number of chiefs under Makoni, all except four agreed to revolt, and several whites were murdered.

The report that a party headed by the Marquis Demones consisting of 35 men, bound for Sudan in order to enlist Arab chiefs against the British, has been massacred to a man, is confirmed. The members of the Delor Demons expedition were killed near Godames.

Sunk With All Aboard.

LONDON, June 18.—A despatch received here by Lloyds from Ushant, near Brest, France, says that a steamer, supposed to be the Drummond Castle, British of London, has gone down near Ushant, with 350 persons on board. Two men were picked up by fishermen and it appeared that very many lives have been lost. This message was sent from Ushant at 3 40 p. m. yesterday. The Drummond Castle was of about 2,350 tons register.

The report has been confirmed.

Used Holy Water.

SHARON, Pa., June 18.—One of the most remarkable incidents that has ever occurred in this vicinity took place yesterday near Fredonia, in the northern part of this country. During the past winter Miss Inez McLaughlin, a daughter of Eugene McLaughlin, a respectable farmer living near Fredonia, was stricken with paralysis, which finally extended through her whole system, depriving her of her sight, use of her limbs, powers of speech and finally from swallowing. The girl was slowly dying of starvation. All efforts to relieve the pain were futile and all hopes of her recovery were given up. A Mr. Sewing, advised the application of the holy water of Lourdes, which is so widely known for its miraculous cures, and comes from the south of France. Yesterday the water was received, and when applied to the young girl's lips she said: "Mamma, I can talk." She was rubbed in the water, and recovered her sight and the use of her limbs. In a few hours she was able to go about as though nothing had happened.

Ritchie had Provost down and was choking him, when a brother of Provost struck Ritchie a terrible blow on the head with a peevie, which knocked him senseless. Drs. Lunan and Verner were called and the man taken to the hospital, where he died to-day. Both of the Provosts are in jail. Ritchie belongs to Rogersville and leaves a wife and family.

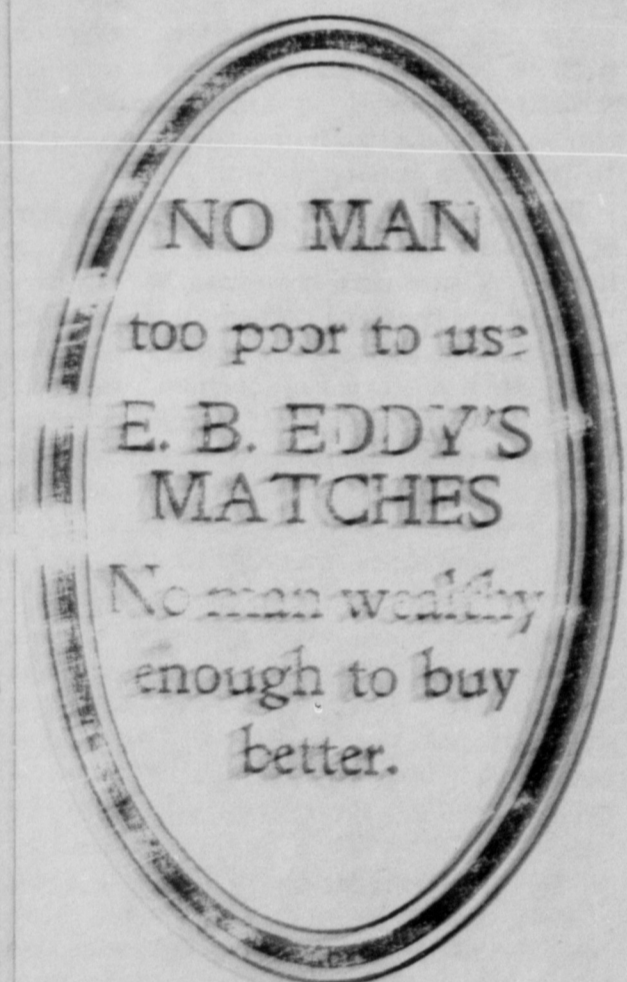
