

Adjusting the saddle properly has much to do with safe and comfortable riding. The rule should be to keep the saddle as near parallel to the bar as possible. Avoid tilting, especially backward. Breathe through the nose; if forced to breathe through the mouth, keep the tongue well pressed against the upper front teeth-to avoid inhalation of cold air, the force of which should be broken by passing through the nose and warmed for inspiration.

A sponge bath with tepid water and friction is beneficial immediately after a ride in the open air. Sponging with diluted alcohol relieves the muscular soreness and stiffness.

Ice cold drinks, pastry and sweets are not conducive to health at any time. A cyclist, after a long spin, needs foods to supply the tissue waste. The hunger which a ride in the park provokes is such that one can and should eat only health-producing food. "Hungry enough to eat anything!" That anything should be fruit, sandwiches and milk. Tea made from beef extract is stimulating and refreshing.

Violent riding will produce heart disease. Women suffering from shortness of breath will find the exercise dangerous.

Only a sponge and friction bath should be taken immediately after riding. The body is too fatigued; a full plunge is then too exhausting.

With proper adjustment of the saddle and attention to dress at seasonable times moderate cycling will result in benefit to the majority of women.-Philadelphia Times.



Telegraphing Without Connecting Wires. Interesting experiments have recently been made under Mr. W. H. Preece, with a view to electric communication between distant points without wire connection, namely, through air, water, or earth. Mr. Preece proposed to conduct experiments in three different methods. First, by running a wire along the shore on light poles for a distance of about a mile, and a second wire from stem to stern of the ship, the two acting upon each other inductively through the intervening space; secondly. by suspending a creature, which has been flying around short line over the side of the ship, so in freedom, to put itself into harness that it might dip into the sea in the direction of the end of the shore line, to work by conduction through the sea; and, thirdly, by running out a light cable from the shore to the ship, termin-ating in a coil at the bottom of the sea, near the ship, but not attached to it, while another coil is placed on board. These two coils are expected to act inductively, and to give ample sound on telephones by means of rapid alterna-tions. The experiments by the first method have been carried to a successful issue within the last few days, the shore wire having been erected along the Welsh coast, commencing at Lavernock Point, a little south of Cardiff, and proceeding for a mile in the direction of Lavernock House. The lightship was represented for the occasion by the island of Flat Holme, in the Bristol Channel; and the line there erected, parallel to the first and three miles distant from it, was about half a mile long. The shore line was furnished with a powerful generator at Lavernock Point, and the island line with a sounder to receive the messages. The result was that the words dispatched into the mainland wire were heard on the island with perfect distinctness, but we can scarcely admit that Flat Holmes represents the condi-tions of a ship. On a line running round the world from four to eight or nine degrees there are patches over which rain seldom ceases to fall. This is called the "zone of constant precipitation," but at the same time there are several localities along it with very little rainfall. The divisions are most capricious. Thus, ama has a six months' dry season and a very fine wet one, Colon, on the other side of the Isthmus, about 37 miles away, is deluged with rain during the wet season.

He Could Cook.

A Lewiston man has been complaining lately that his wife does not pay enough attention to cooking "for to-morrow." At such times his wife was at supper time Monday night. He didn't answer, but after supper he filled the cook stove with wood, took off his coat and started in. He got her cook book down and began at the commencement, and made two pans of doughnuts, two batches of biscuit, molasses gingerbread, hasty pudding to fry for breakfast, cookies, tarts, six custard pies, boiled vegetables for breakfast hash, and in half an hour had the stove covered with dishes of all kinds. His wife went out into the kitchen and dropped speechless into a chair. At half past 11 that night he washed the last dish and closed the dumb wa'ter-filled with food which compared very well with some his wife had made, and went to bed. The next noon his wife handed him a bill of \$7.49 which she said was the amount of raw material he had used the night before. "Are you going to cook as much as that every day?" she asked.-Lewiston Journal.
