It is said of Florentine Magliabecchi that he could not only remember the entire contents of any book he had read, but he could give at once the number of the page upon which any quotation therefrom occurred. This marvel of his age could also describe in minute detail every place he had once visited.

Some minds have a wonderful capacity for imbibing languages. Perhaps the most extraordinary of these the world has ever seen was the case of Mezzofanti. This genius was the son of a carpenter, but in early youth was adopted by a priest who had him educated for the priesthood. career Mezzofanti had completely mastered the Latin, Greek, Hebrew, Arabic, Spanish, In 1841, Guido Gorres wrote that Mezzofanti could read and write forty different languages; and it is stated that so well acquainted was he with all dialects and provincialisms, that he could detect the precise part of the country to which a man belonged. His proficiency may be further understood when it is said that he was at different times taken to be a Portuguese and an Englishman, by inhabitants of these respective countries. Before his death
