

# THE WIDE, WIDE WORLD

A box containing a few pounds' worth of copper, fell off a tray in Northumberland Avenue, London, the other day when the street was crowded, scattering the coins in every direction. There was a rush made for the coins, but when a policeman asked for the money to be delivered up there was a general complaisance, and on counting the whole ten pounds was found without a copper missing.

When William Caxton printed his first edition of Chaucer's Canterbury Tales, in 1478, he thought that in 1896 the precious volume would be sold for upward of twenty times its weight in gold. One of the only two perfect copies in existence fetched \$9,400 at a sale in London lately.

A funny story is going the rounds about Lord Carrington, to the effect that at the last drawing-room held by the Queen, he, in announcing the names of the ladies present, a cord to his duty as Lord Chamberlain got "mixed," and announced a certain Mrs. M. as "Lady M." Thereupon the Queen bent forward to greet her with the kiss on the cheek that is always given to wives and daughters of peers. As she bent, Lord Carrington found out his mistake, and gasped out: "Don't kiss her, ma'am, don't kiss her. She's not a lady at all!"

Miss Cordelia Sorrell, the Parsee young woman who was recently admitted to the bar, has just succeeded in getting her first client acquitted of manslaughter in the Poona hall.

Two thousand men from all the districts of Ontario arrived at Toronto in one day last week, on their way to Manitoba and the Northwest to get in the wheat crop. They went westward on special trains.

In his pay envelope a Pennsylvania Railroad employee living at Valparaiso, Ind., found a \$5 note on which was written: "This bill represents the last of a fortune, all squandered on women, wine and cards."

Tipton Village P. E. I., was burned out Sunday. Upwards of forty buildings were destroyed, including Myrick & Co.'s store and warehouses. Dalton Chaisson's, McLeod's and Bernard Brown's store, warehouse, residences and outbuildings, Mr. Hackett's (M. P.) fine residence; McKenna's and Bernard's hotel, the railway round house, agent's residence, coal sheds, one engine and several cars. Loss \$100,000; insurance \$25,000.

A despatch from Zanzibar says the German consul there has refused to surrender to the British officials Said Khalid, the self-proclaimed Sultan, and those of his followers who took refuge at the consulate after being driven from the palace by the bombardment of British warships. Emperor William and the Minister of Foreign Affairs have resolved not to assent to Great Britain's conversion of the protectorate of Zanzibar into a crown colony. They will agree to Said Khalid being surrendered to the British authorities if he is guaranteed treatment as a prince and a prisoner of war.

A man arrived at Johannesburg in the early days of the mining boom with no assets save a tin of condensed milk and a needle. He spread a report that smallpox was on its way through the country, gave out that he was a surgeon and vaccinated the whole community with his needle and condensed milk at five shillings per operation. When last heard of he was a wealthy capitalist, enjoying the monopoly of selling liquors within the precincts of the Johannesburg stock exchange.
