> The writer is now finishing this letter in the house in which Sir Leonard was born and which is now used as a place of summer resort, and the monument mentioned can be seen from the window. Who can estimate the value of the changes that Canada has seen since this noble son of Queen's first saw the light.

> Close to the church but beyond it lies J. R. Curry, the father of the now famous and able lawyer, L A. Curry. Mr. Currey is now well up in the eighties but his memory and his judgment are clear and distinct. The writer learned more of Queens and Sunbury from him than from anyone else since coming to the county. His memory recalls with great vividness the stories told by his father and other old soldiers of the long and bitter struggle of the Revolution. The names of Gates, André, Washington and others well known to history, are to him household words. The dark days in which brave men, who r fused to be false to their flag and their king were mobbed and murdered, persecuted and even hanged in front of their own doors, for being true to their duty and the oaths, by men who now are by some not knowing the facts as to their infamous crimes, exalted as heroes and patriots. The stories of these old Loyalists show more and more clearly how causeless and how easily averted was the American Revolution, and how inexpressibiy base and cruel was the conduct of the leaders.

> Situated at the mouth of the stream leading to that inland sea, Grand Lake, Gagetown has a large trade with the people living along its banks. It is also the shiretown of Queens and so has considerable political influence. In fact in no place in N. B., will one hear political issues more aply discussed than here. The shiretown is largely Conservative as is the wealthier and more independent parishes. The Liberal strength is where the influence of the lumber kings is most strongly fel .


The recent contest, however, does not clearly indicate the political standing of the parties. It is an undeniable fact. which, while regretting it, no candid Conservative can deny, that the contest was not popular in Queens. Rightly or wrongly they feel that they had beer forced into it. Again it is quite true that personal jealousies had a large share in the result. That Baird, Perley and McLean, the three leading Conservatives of the county refused to support Mr. Wilmot, while still claiming to be loyal to their party, was at the outset a bad omen which should have received more attention than was given. A leader or a candidate may be of the best character but it he cannot command the solid following of his party he is not the best for such a position. Mr Wilmot is a fine man, and has a reputation that will always com mand respect, yet the fact that he is per sonally at varience with some of the strongest men of his riding fully explains his two defeats.

The writer on coming into the county was not long in finding out that some serious blunder had been made and endeavored to have them remedied. It was however, too late. A very important vote was allowed to go to Blair without an effort being made to keep it at all commensurate with its importance.
