The best blood of the Old Land has been planted on the banks of our Canadian Rhine and its influence is felt far and wide.

It is not to be wandered at, that nurtured amid such scenes of beauty and with such traditions, that the people of this section should be cultured, kind, hospitable and true to all the traditions of the race. Such the writer found them and such they will remain. THE GYPSY MOTH.

WHICH COSTS A STATE OVER ONE MILLION DOLLARS.

Desperate Efforts Made in Massachusetts to Exterminate the Nuisance-Peculiar Origin of the Pest.

After spending \$195,000 during the past six years in waging war upon the gypsy moth the state of Massachusetts has just made another appropriation of \$150,000 for the same purpose. The moth will eat up that trifle in less time than it takes to collect it of the taxpayers and go marching on in countless millions more ready to meet the next attack.

Mr. Fernald, the entomologist of the Massachusetts state board of agriculture, estimates that it will require \$200,000 a year for the next five years, then \$100,-000 a year for five years more and then another period of five years at \$15,000 per year-\$1,575,000 in all-to extirpate this pest. This, of course, is saying nothing of the hundreds of thousands of dollars' damage that will be done in the meantime to trees and crops.

And, says the New York World, it all came about because a Frenchman 28 years ago left a tray standing by an open window where the wind whisked its contents out to the ground below and then scattered them hither and thither. The Frenchman was Mr. Trouvelot and the contents of the tray were eggs of the gypsy moth Mr. Trouvelot had brought with him to Massachusetts from Paris. The Frenchman knew the mischief he had inadvertently wrought, for he knew the gypsy moth-knew its astounding breeding powers and knew the damage it had done in France. No living creature, unless it be the Australian rabbit, has such tremendous capacity for reproduction as this devastating moth or

In a few years after that unlucky puff of wind in the vicinity of Medford had sown the seed fully 30 townships in Massachusetts were being ravaged by the moth. It was like trying to bail out the ocean with a spoon for individual farmers or even committees to make war upon the invaders. Where thousands were killed hundreds of thousands sprang up in a night to take their places and breed millions more.

It was evident that something more than spasmodic effort at extermination or the state of Massachusetts would be stripped bare of foliage.



So Gov. Brackett called the attention of the legislature to the subject, and seven years ago the war on the gypsy moth which has been raging was formally declared. How little the Massachusetts statesmen knew the formidable nature of the foe they were fighting is shown by the insignficance of the sum they appropriated-\$25,000-to carry on the conflict. They might as well have thrown their money to the winds. The next year the moths were worse than they had ever been before, and they have been growing steadily worse from year to year

But Massachusetts has not thus far followed the lead of Australia in calling upon the world for help in exterminating her porlific rabibts and offering enormous rewards for any recipe that would destroy them. Massachusetts has undertaken her own fight and seems at last to realize the magnitude of what she has on her hands. It is true that at a former sesson of congress Massachusetts did ask for a appropriation of \$40,000 to help her carry on the war. But congress eclined. It was decided to take no part n a insect war that was entirely local. So Massackusetts was left to work out her own salvation, and she has gone into he task with all her traditional energy of purpose.
