Nine Blown To Pieces. HARTSVILLE, TENN., July 7.—A boiler exploded on the farm of W. A. Allen, this county, yesterday, and Mr. Allen and eight persons were killed instantly, and five badly injured.

Death in Floods. LONDON, July 7.—The Paris correspondent of the Morning Post says: "The recent floods in the South of France are the worst that have occurred since 1875. It is believed that fifty persons have been drowned in the Department of Auch alone, although the inhabitants were warned of the impending disaster. The fireman and the militaty did their utmost to assist, but the flood was so swift that many were literally swept away. Similar reports come from other towns. Damage to the value of hundreds of thousands of pounds has been done by hailstones in the regions of Lyons, Limoges, Castets and Le Puy. Many laborers have been killed by lightning and hailstones."
