He was the Minister thirty years ago, when it was first organized A Canadian exchange in speaking of his work while Minister, says : "Mr. Mitchell understands the maritime and fishing interests of Canada. As the Minister of Marine and Fisheries in the ConservativeGovernment formed immediately after Confederation, he organized the department and no minister of that day more faithfully and conscientiously labored to have that organization 'effective.' It was during this first administration, too, that it became necessary to protect our fisheries. Though the United States had abrogated the Washington treaty in 1866, the young Dominion found the Yankee fishermen boldly continuing to exercise the priveleges their government had renounced. Mr. Mitchell organized a fleet of cruisers, and these, which were at first rather riducled and called 'Peter Mitchell's pirates,' proved decidedly 'effective.' Vessel after vessel, fishing inside the three mile limit was seized and confiscated, and the determination shown even thus early in the history of Confederation to protect our rights and its effects. 


