



London, April 8 .- Advices from Delagoa Bay announce that the country bord. ering on and across Limpopo River, forming for many miles the northwest and northern limit of the Transvaal, is in open revolt. It is added that the position is seriou, as troops are leaving for Delagoa Bay by the steamer Carnavon. A further rising is expected in Maputaland.

Despatches recevied in London from Pretoria and Delagoa Bay last night announce that the whole of Gazaland is in open revolt. Twenty five thousand natives have rebelled against the Portuguese government. The principal rising, it was stated, was only about forty miles from the Transvaal border. It was added that the Portuguese troops were mobilizing rapidly, and that the situation was regarded as most serious.


By Cigarettes.
