FREDERICTON, Feb. 11.—Hon. Mr. Tweedie this afternoon submitted the estimates, which are as follows:

The net debt was decreased by amount invested in sinking fund under 50th Vic., chap. 11, imported horses, \$2,000; by amount invested in sinking fund under 54th Vic., chap. 3, \$4,500; by interest received, \$910.59, making a total of \$7,410.59.

It would be found on reference to page 22 of the report of the commissioner of public works, that there had been expended, under Act of Assembly 59th Vic., cap. 32 m., during the past year the sum of \$32,445.01 on permanent bridges.

Creton Troubles May Inflamm Europe.

Boston, Feb. 12.—A despatch to the Herald from Vienna says: The Vienna cabinet has addressed a most serious warning to Greece. From exclusive sources it is learned that the powers have informed Turkey that they cannot force Greece to withdraw her fleet, but will leave Turkey a free hand.

LONDON, Feb. 12.—The Greek charge d'affaires here has informed Lord Salisbury that his government has decided to prevent the Turks landing any reinforcements upon the Island of Crete.

In the House of Commons to-day Mr. Geo. N. Curzon announced that the latest news received by the government showing situation in Crete was that the Christians were the aggressors and were attacking the Moslems in many locations.

CONSTANTINOPLE, Feb. 12.—The Porte has given assurance to the powers that Turkey will not send reinforcements to Crete.

LONDON, Feb. 12.—A despatch from Constantinople says that 4,000 Creton insurgents are known to be concentrated in the vicinity of Canea, awaiting the arrival of arms, ammunition and equipments from Sphakia, on the south coast, near the western extremity of the Island of Crete, where they have been landed by expeditions from Greece.

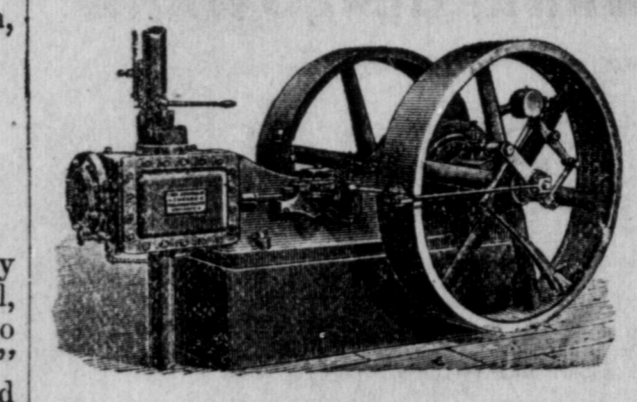
