COUNTY COUNCIL.—The annual session of the Kent County Council was brought to a close Saturday evening. The total indebtedness of the county was shown to be about \$17000. Much fault was found with the way in which the taxes were collected by many of the collectors in the different parishes (or rather the way in which they were not collected) many returns showing a delinquency of from 25 to 50 per cent. 
