DOMINION PARLIAMENT.

OTTAWA, June 4.—Mr. McDougall enquired whether it was true that the Intercolonial had lost \$30,000 in the operation of the Bay des Chaleurs for a few months.

Mr. Fielding promised the information later on.

The ways and means committee devoted the most of the afternoon to discussing the wheat duty, the members from Manitoba supporting the government stating that the grain duty was no good to the west and western conservatives expressing a contrary opinion.

The early part of the evening was occupied with the book and paper schedule.

Ross Robertson pressed the copyright question. Mr. Fielding stated while Mr. Laurier was in England he would discuss the matter with the British Government. Meantime the course of the late government would be continued.

When oil was reached Mr. Richardson of Manitoba moved that oil be placed on the free list. The motion was declared defeated.

Mr. Ellis of St. John moved a reduction from five cents to three. This was supported by so many liberals that Sir Charles Tupper said he thought he would have to come to the rescue of the government. The motion was finally put and lost.

Ganong of Charlotte moved that the duty be four cents. This was also lost.

Davin moved that it be one cent and this met the same fate.

Mr. Ellis thought the duty on sawn marble was too high.

In the leather schedule on motion of Patterson scrap leather was changed from 16 1/2 per cent. to 15 per cent.

The committee rose and the house adjourned at midnight, good progress having been made.

The Senate in committee considered the criminal code amendment bill. The reduction clause was rejected, leaving the age sixteen and twenty one years, reducing the minimum age of men who are punishable for seducing females under promise of marriage. A motion to remove this age limit was rejected.

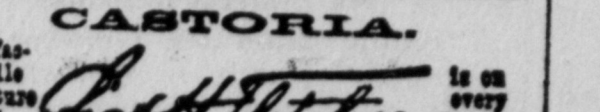

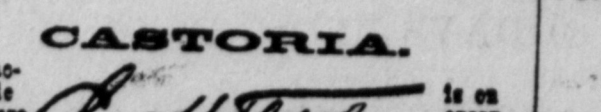
