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According to the Congregationalist, during the last six years theological students in German universities have decreased from 4,527 to 2,956. The causes seem to be a weakening of faith through extreme liberalism, the overcrowding of the ministry and the very small salary paid to pastors. In Prussia a minister at the beginning receives \$450 and cannot expect at any time to receive more than \$900. It is significant that the only two universities which report increased attendance of theological students are Griefswald and Erlangen, which are among the less famous but which are most conservative.
