

OTTAWA NEWS.

OTTAWA, Nov. 21.—The imperial government has awarded a jubilee medal to Gen. Gascoigne in recognition of his having sent such an excellent contingent to represent the dominion at the Queen's jubilee.

Notice has been sent out to the collectors of customs stating that swine for slaughter imported from the United States must be immediately replaced in a bonded warehouse or yard, as approved by the department.

Hon. Mr. Hills, the new minister of justice, arrived yesterday and took charge of his department.

Mowat's and Mills' appointments were gazetted yesterday.

The reports to the department of agriculture from the English commission houses state that the butter shipped from the creameries in the territories to Great Britain is very satisfactory, although the market is somewhat depressed at present.

CUBAN REBELLION.

MADRID, Nov. 21.—The royal decree for the establishment of autonomy in Cuba will be submitted to a cabinet council tomorrow.

HAVANA, Nov. 21.—About seventy of the recent inmates of the Mantanzas jail have been stricken down with what is supposed to be beri-beri.

Captain General Blanco has called for a public subscription on behalf of the afflicted persons, and has himself subscribed \$100.

NEW YORK, Nov. 21.—Marquis Apóstegui, leader of the Conservative party in Cuba, arrived here to-day from Havana.

The marquis said he had been in Spain for the last year, and that he would return to Havana Wednesday.

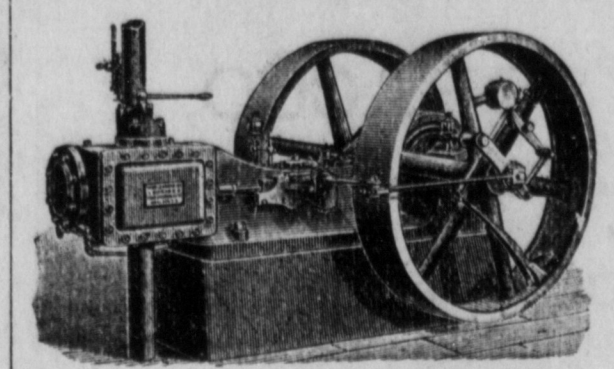
