OHN WATKA, AN INDIAN EXECUTED MURDER.

CHELSEA, I. T., Nov. 1.-To-day John B. Watka, the Cree Indian who shot Jonas Deer, another member of his own tribe! was executed for the crime on Saturday. The men were rivals for the hand of the same girl and fought at a dance at which she was present to decide who should marry her. Watka killed Deer and afterwards married the Indian maiden. 
