

FIRST TO BE BUILT IN AMERICA.

BATH, ME., Nov. 11.—The Bath Iron Works to-day received a contract for a huge steel cargo steamer to be constructed for the firm of Miller, Bull & Knowlton, of New York city.

The vessel will be provided with two Scotch boilers. The engines are triple expansion of 1300 horse-power, capable of driving the steamer at the rate of 10 knots an hour.

This is the first steamer of the kind to be built in America. It is the idea to have her constructed so that she can be economically run, and be able to compete, and, it is hoped, drive out foreign vessels of this type.

THE BRITISH WOOD MARKET.

LIVERPOOL, Nov. 1.—The arrivals from British North America during the past month were 26 vessels, 20,142 tons, against 33 vessels, 22,732 tons, during the corresponding month last year.

The volume of business during the past month has been fair, but values of most articles are unsatisfactory and difficult to maintain; stocks are all ample, some much too heavy.

Birch.—Logs are in slightly better request, but prices rule low, and the stock is excessive. Planks have been imported more freely, there is a fair demand, but prices have again declined and are now at the lowest point touched this season; the stock is sufficient.

NEW STATE OF MANHATTAN.

ALBANY, N. Y., Nov. 11.—When the Legislature meets here one of the first bills introduced, says Assemblyman Patrick Trainor of the 13th district of New York city, will be one providing for creating a new state by permitting a constitutional amendment to be passed and approved by the United States government dividing 16 counties of the state and including them in what shall be known as the State of Manhattan.

The counties which it is proposed to set off are: New York, Kings, Queens, Richmond, Suffolk, Westchester, Orange, Putnam, Dutchess, Columbia, Ulster, Greene, Rockland, Albany, Rensselaer, and part of Schaharie, to be formed into one state, with a population of 3,903,220, as compared with 2,631,123 for the 44 remaining counties.

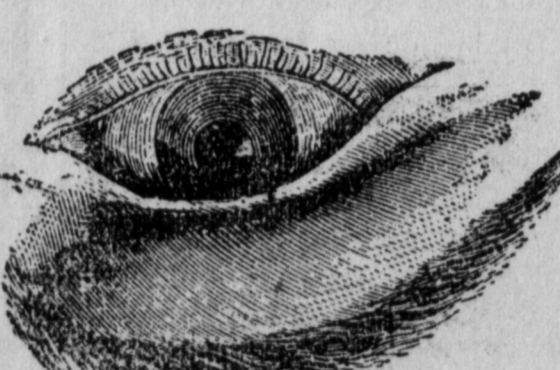

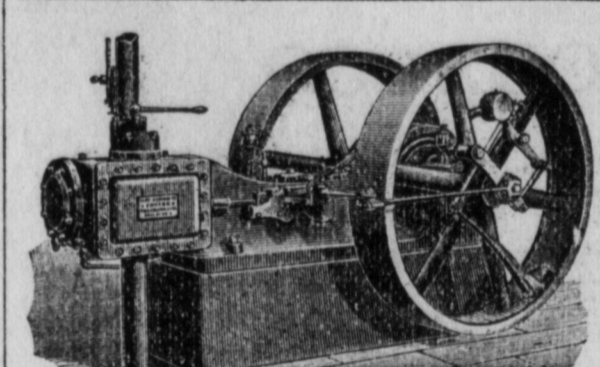

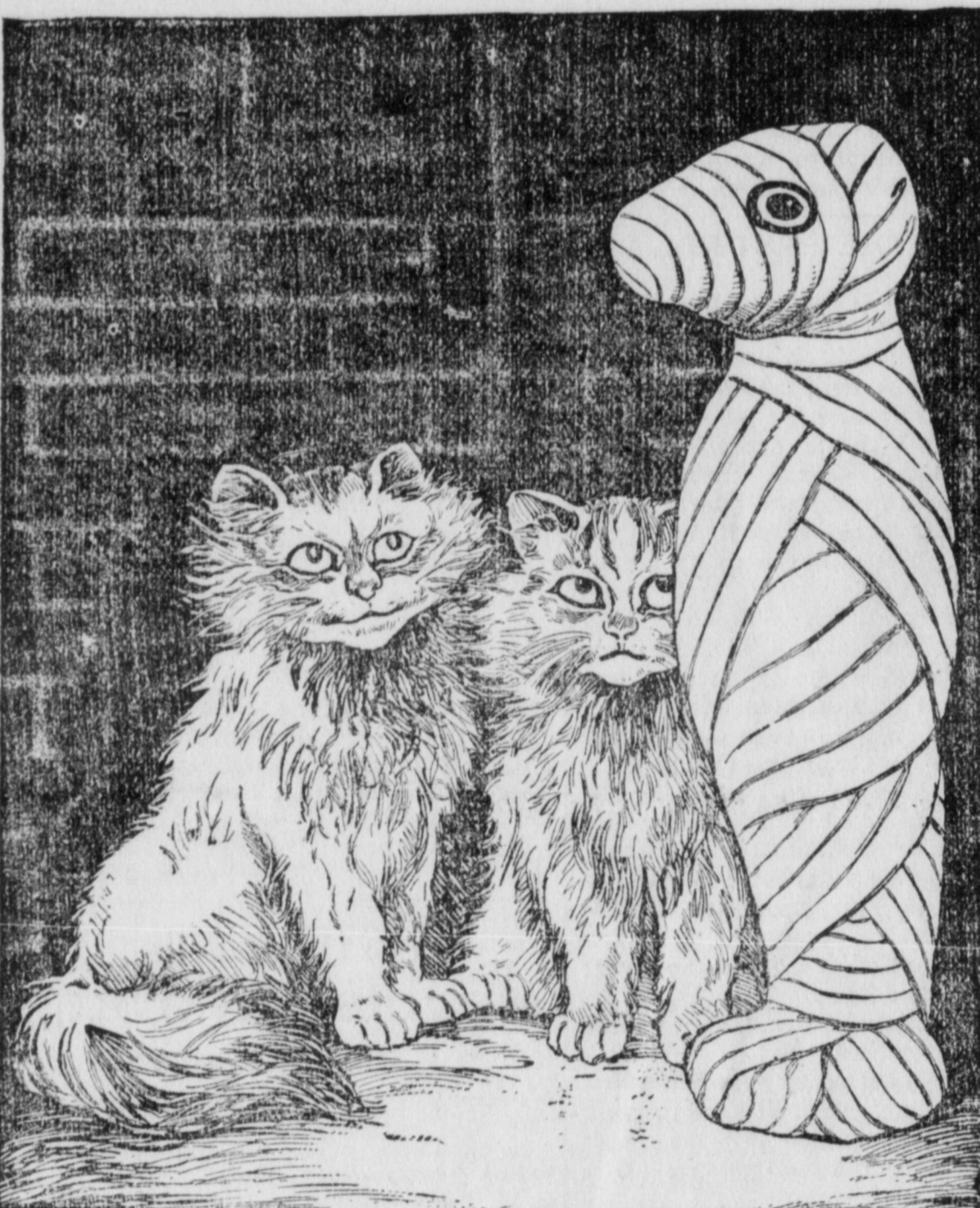

TO BEAT ELECTRIC LIGHTS.

GERMAN INVENTS A GAS BURNER TO EMIT 1,500 CANDLE POWER.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 12.—United States Consul P. V. Denster at Crefeld, Germany, reports an invention which promises a great advancement in the illuminating power of gas. Ernest Salzenberg, director of the gas works of the city of Crefeld, has invented an improvement in incandescent gas burners which relates to the production of incandescent gaslight based upon the discovery that when the pressure of the gas is considerably increased upon the incandescent body it emits a golden yellow light, agreeable to the eye, displaying objects in their natural colors.

The light is of such intensity that a person is able to read the finest print at a distance of one hundred to one hundred and fifty feet. The inventor says that the cost of his incandescent light of one thousand five hundred candle power is only four and one-half cents an hour while that of the ordinary electric light of four hundred candle power is (in Germany) fourteen cents an hour.

THE PEACOCK AT HOME.

The real home of the peacock or peafowl is in India. There they were and are hunted and their flesh is used for food.
