Black bears are getting scarce in the Yellowstone Park and Dr. W. A. Croffut who had just returned from a trip there has entered a protest with the Interior Department against the suggestion of Superintendent Young that the black bear in the Park be diminished in number by being captured and given to museums.

There were 28 business failures in the Dominion this week, compared with 30 in the corresponding week last year.

Col. White, ex-deputy postmaster general, has, at the request of Hon. Mr. Mulock, visited the leading post offices in the United States to report on the systems of postal promotion.

The McKay Milling Company, Ottawa on Friday filled an order of the Russian government for three hundred sacks of the best Canadian oats. The grain has been shipped direct to St. Petersburg.

It is said in Ottawa that Sir Charles Tupper is so immersed in business matters that he wants to be relieved of the leadership of the Conservative party.

Fire at Toronto on Friday did \$30,000 damage to the wholesale grocery house of H. P. Eckhardt. Rats nibbling at matches was the cause. In the same city in the evening the Musee theatre was badly damaged by fire and smoke.

The Peary Expedition.

BOSTON, Sept. 25.—The steam whaling bark Hope, Captain John Bartlett, which has just returned from the Arctic, arrived here at 6.30 o'clock this morning from Sydney, C. B., having on board a number of those who took part in the expedition, including Mr. and Mrs. Lee of New Haven who enjoyed their honeymoon under the Arctic circle and six Esquimaux, while in the hold of the vessel is the meteorite which Lieut. Peary first found in May, 1894.

In speaking of the last expedition, Lieut. Peary said: "I consider the chief things accomplished were the arrangements with the Esquimaux for my next year's journey. Then the second event of importance is the bringing of the meteorite to this country. The statement appearing in the papers that we had discovered some gresneous things about the hut of the Greely expedition, is all nonsense. We found no "graveyard belongings," we found that the conditions were such that we could reach the place where the Greely expedition had made their camp, and although it was August 23, we found things inside the hut covered several feet with snow.

Owing to the protracted campaign against the Mohmands Gen. Sir Wm. Lockhart, commander of the Punjab frontier force and in supreme control of the punitive operations, has postponed the general advance against the Afridis and Tirah, their summer headquarters, until October 9. The Afridis are encamped in a strong position on a rugged plateau, which it will be most difficult to scale, and they are assembled in great force.

An explosion occurred in the Williamson County Coal Company's mine near Marion, Ill., on Friday. Fifteen wounded miners, two of whom have since died, were rescued. Five or six men were left imprisoned in the burning mine.

Tug Pioneer, which has arrived at Port Townsend, Wash., brings a report of a landslide near Sheep Camp on the Chilcoat Pass last Sunday morning, in which eighteen men are said to have lost their lives. Only one body is said to have been recovered, that of Choynski, the prize-fighter.

At the session of the Sovereign Grand Lodge of Oddfellows in Springfield, Ill., on Friday, a resolution was passed providing that after January 1st, 1897, no grand or supreme body shall receive any consideration for old rituals destroyed or returned, but shall pay full price for all rituals furnished. There is little doubt that the Rebekeh ritual will be revised, as there has been much dissatisfaction over it.

Thus far there have been a few less than one hundred cases and fifteen deaths from yellow fever at New Orleans. Mayor Flower says he proposes to exhaust every power at his command to establish peace, and he says that if it requires all of the forces of the city and state he is determined that the Beaugard school building shall be used as a temporary hospital. No effort or expense will be spared in bringing to justice the men who had fired the school building Thursday night. The mayor has the support in his course of well nigh the entire community.

On Friday ex-Chief of Police Eduardo Velasquez, who was arrested for alleged complicity in the murder of Arroyo, who attempted to assassinate the President of Mexico, shot himself in the left temple dying instantly.
