WOMAN'S STATUS IN JAPAN.

In spite of the rapid strides Japan has been making towards civilization, her women are still in a very different position from those in Christian countries.

JOHN WALSH SENTENCED.

SEVEN YEARS IN DORCHESTER PENITENTIARY.

John Walsh, who was convicted on Saturday afternoon of manslaughter, was sentenced this morning by Judge McLeod to seven years imprisonment in Dorchester penitentiary. A large number of persons assembled in court to hear the sentence.

The judge's charge was brief and practical, and he did not keep the prisoner long in suspense of what his fate was to be. At ten o'clock sharp Judge McLeod took his seat, and after the roll of the grand jury had been called, the prisoner was brought into court and ordered to stand up. In his address Judge McLeod told the prisoner he had stood a fair trial and had been unable to clear himself.

The prisoner took the result coolly, but his mother and sisters were greatly moved by the sentence.

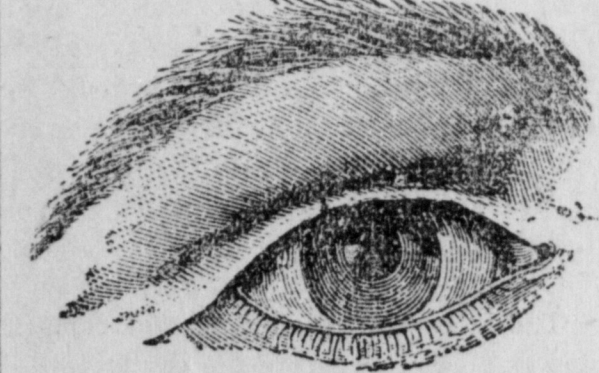

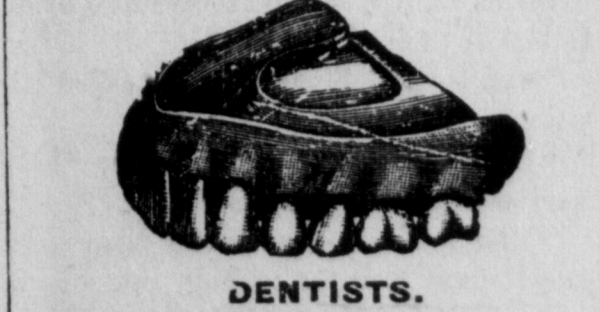

HIS SAFE OPENED AND FOUND FILLED WITH STOLEN PROPERTY.

BELLE PLAINS, Ia., Dec. 3.—The safe of A. E. Sibley, a merchant in Sheffield, Iowa, who was shot and killed while robbing a neighboring store, has been opened. In the safe were many diamond rings, gold bracelets and jewelry of every description, including seventeen gold watches.
