FATAL ACCIDENTS.

NICHOLASVILLE, Ky., Dec. 18.—Three small children of Mr. and Mrs. Samuel Reynolds, aged 6, 3 and 1 years respectively, were burned to death to-day. They had been locked in the house while Mr. and Mrs. Reynolds were on a visit to a neighbor. The parents returned in time to see the house collapse.

WINSLOW, Me., Dec. 17.—George P. Blackman, the 10 year old son of Frank Blackman, was drowned this morning while skating on the Sebasticook, half a mile from its mouth. The heat of his shoe came off and he was unable to stop himself from going into the open water in the middle of the stream. The body was recovered three hours later.

LOUISA, Ky., Dec. 17.—At Alliance post office, Floyd county, Nelson Hamilton was pouring out some gunpowder from a keg when his four year old son picked up a small amount and tossed it into the fire. The explosion threw some embers into the pile of powder and a terrific explosion followed. The father and little son and two older children who were in the room were knocked insensible. The ceiling was lifted from its place, the walls spread and the upper part of the house came down and stopped about half way on the walls, thus fastened all the doors. When the oldest daughter regained consciousness sufficiently to realize that the house was in flames she tried to open a door, but seeing the hopelessness of such an effort began to scream for help. A neighbor carried the injured persons out, but they were so badly burned that all died within a few hours.

An investigation has disclosed the fact that many of the local school children have been spending their money for the intoxicating candies. The matter has been taken up by a church society and vigorous action will be taken at a meeting to-night.


