

### Frevention of Disease.

Mr Miles Menander Dawson, a consulting actuary and anthor of standard works on life insurance. says in an interview "From one-tifth to one-half of the deaths that occur in youth and middle age could be prevented by a decent regard for sanitary conditions and by common action of society for the benefit of all. It is not enough that a man should take care of himself. Disease is communicable, and protecting man against it is a social function.

"Fully one-fifth of the total number of deaths are caused by zymotic diseases which are as purely accidental as falling and breaking a leg. And onefourth of the deaths in addition are from digestive and respiratory diseases. almost all of which are preventable. About 17 per cent of the deaths among insured lives is from consumption and 5 per cent from nervous diseases, all of which are now believed to be prevent able.

"This means that fully one-half of the deaths among young and middle aged persons could be prevented and the proportion could no doubt be greatly increased if parents paid a proper respect to the laws of heredity It would certainly be a most important achieve ment for the human race if united action could be taken to secure that a larger proportion of persons would attain old age than at presnt "-Ainslee's Magazine.



## HOW TO BOIL CLOTHES.

The purpose of boiling clothes is to ex pand the fabrics by steam and thus to loosen the dirt and allow it to drop out. There is no good, but actual harm, derived from "cooking" the clothes. They do not require "cooking," but cleansing and when they are cleansed that is sufficient. Hence, within half an hour after the water first begins to bubble they should be immediately removed and plunged into clear, cold water. While the clothes are boiling they may be turn ed with a clothes stick, but must not be punched or lifted in such a manner to atear them.

'The common custon in many households of putting the second boilerful of clothes into the boiling dirtied water from which the first boilerful has been taken is wholly opposed to good laundry work. When the cook wishes to keep the juice in the meat that is to be cocked by boiling, she plunges it into boiling






