FISH IN THE YUKON COUNTRY. OTTAWA, Jan. 14-The Department of

Fisheries has received a report from the former officer of the department who is now resident in Dawson and who has made an investigation into the fisheries of the Yukon and its tributary streams. There has been a general impression that fish life does not exist so far north as the Yukon. This report which has just been received corrects that and shows that there is a considerable variety of fish iife, including such well-known varieties as white fish, buffalo fish, pike and grayling of a superior kind, which can be used for food supply. Several of the larger lake fishing companies are at work and find that they are able to realize handsome profits therefrom.

He still has land enough to give each one of his 73,000,000 children a nice little homestead of eight acres each and still have a ranch of over 16,-000,000 acres left. In other words, your dear old uncle still owns something over 600,000,000 acres, distributed as follows throughout the various states and territories:

Alabama, 532,339 acres; Arizona, 54,400,211 acres; Arkansas, 3,922,042 acres; California, 43,841,044 acres; Colorado, 4,037,204 acres; Florida, 1,797,662 acres; Idaho, 45,962,855 acres; Kansas, 1,046,589 acres; Louisiana, 845,020 acres; Michigan, 522,431

Lobster Fishery Bay of Fundy. PUBLIC NOTICE is particularly directey to the following Special Fishery Regulation ap-proved by His Excellency the Governor General in Council, on the eighth day of July, 1898, fixing the legal size limit under which the capture of lobsters in the waters of the Bay of Fundy is pro-

hibited. "From and after the 1st day of January, 1899, "on and along that part of the coast of the prov "inces of Nova Scotia and New Brunswick, ex-"tending from Cape Sable in a westerly and north-"westerly direction, to and including the whole "coast of the Bay of Fundy and following that "coast to the International Boundary Line be-"tween the province of New Brunswick and the "State of Maine, and including also the coast of "all the Islands 'ying in such Bay of Fundy and "the waters of Canada in such Bay and between "the above points, it shall be unlawful to fish for "catch, kill, buy, sell, can, cure, preserve, or "have in possession for any purpose whatever, "any lobster, or lobsters under 10½ inches in "length, measuring from head to tail, exclusive length, measuring from head to tail, exclusive of claws or feelers.

The above regulation does not come into force until the 1st January, 1899, but this notice is de-signed to furnish all persons interested with timely and ample intimation that on and after that date it will be rigidly enforced under the extreme penalties provided by the Fisheries Act, Chapter 95 Revised Statutes of Canada.


