## KENT COUNTY COUNCIL

(Continued from Page 5.)

AFTERNOON SESSION.

JANUARY 12, 1900.

The council called to order at 2 p. m. Couns. all present except Coun. Johnson. Moved by Coun. Landry, seconded by Coun. Richard that the sum of one hundred dollars be appropriated for the Transvaal towards the relief fund for that war, and that the Secretary order the same to be paid. Carried.

There was immense enthusiasm over the note. Some patriotic speeches made. "God Save the Queen" was sung with great heartiness and at the conclusion three rousing cheers. No one who was present could be otherwise than greatly impressed with the great loyalty of the Municipality of Kent County.

Coun. Landry moved, seconded by Coun. McKee, the fees to be paid to the assessors employed in taking the valuations be as follows: Dundas, \$85; St. Marys, \$55; St. Paul, \$40; Wellington, \$90; Richibucto, \$100; St. Louis, \$60; Weldford, \$80; Harcourt, \$50; Carleton, \$60; Acadieville, \$40, and \$50 to each of the valuers.

Moved by Coun. Morton, seconded by Coun. Miller in amendment that the assessors of Weldford be paid \$85 instead of \$80 in the motion and the assessors of Dundas be paid \$80 instead of \$85. Amendment carried, and motion carried with change proposed in the amendment.

Coun. Wathen reports on behalf of the committee in re public wharf, that the committee interviewed Mr. Brown the manager of the Kent Northern Railway, and he asks that the wharf be repaired as he will want the use of it in the spring. He refused to repair it himself and would not pay the rent unless it was repaired. He was of the opinion he would have an action if it were not done.

Moved by Coun. Babineau and seconded by Coun. Barrieau that the report be accepted. Carried.

Coun. C. M. Cormier moved, seconded by Coun. Coates that the bye law of 15th January, 1890, relating to division of St. Marys for Municipal election purposes be rescinded and the following be substituted: St. Marys to be divided into two polling districts, No. 1 to include all that part of the parish north of Buctouche river, polling place to be at or near Vital A. Cormier's. No. 2 to include all that part of the said parish south of Buctouche river, the poll to be at or near Joshua Cormier's. Carried.

Ordered that \$810 be assessed in the county for taking the valuation and added to the warrant for contingencies this year. Ordered that \$1200 be assessed in the county this year for the purpose of defraying principal and interest of debentures issued by the municipality.

Coun. Atkinson brings up the matter of the public wharf and suggests complete repairs.

Moved by Coun. Richard, seconded by

Coun. Barrieau, that this matter be referred to the Finance Committee and report back to the Council. Carried.

Coun. Peters presents petition from inhabitants of Richibucto Cape against sheep running at large in that district, and also a petition opposing the first named petition, and moved that said petition be put on file.

Moved by Coun. Wathen, seconded by Coun. Saulnier that the following bonds in the municipal bye law be expunged: provided that the owner of any bull may on proving to the President or Secretary of the nearest agricultural society, that such bull is of superior breed or is likely to produce superior stock and by obtaining a written permit signed by such President or Secretary suffer such bull to run at large, but in any parish where no such agricultural society is organized a permit may be signed by two magistrates.

Coun. McKee presents petition of J. Johnson, Coatesville, praying for refund of taxes and resolved that the petition be referred to the Councillors of St. Paul and St. Marys.

Moved by Coun. Peters, seconded by Coun. Daigle that a committee be appointed to have the court house building repaired and painted in the lines suggested by the committee who represented it and reported therein to the Board. Carried.

Couns. Peters, Richard and Atkinson appointed said committee.

Coun. Peters, Richard and Atkinson appointed the gaol committee. Joseph Jardine, of Carleton, appointed lumber surveyor of Kent county, also Wilfrid Richard, St. Louis; Frederick Babineau, Acadieville; Robert Wilson, Weldford; John Fitzpatrick and John Finnigan, Richibucto; L. H. Cormier, St. Marys; Mark J. Bourque, St. Paul and William Chandler, Weldford.

Resolved that Council adjourn until 10 a. m. tomorrow to allow the Finance Committee to go into session.

JANUARY 13, 1900.

Council called to order at 10 a. m. All present.

Minutes of last meeting read and approved.

Ordered that \$4500 be assessed on the county for contingencies this year.

Moved by Coun. McKee, seconded by Coun. Barrieau that Coun. Beers be appointed a member of July Committee. Carried.

Moved by Coun. Wathen, seconded by Coun. Cormier that Coun. Poirier be a member of such committee. Carried.

Moved by Coun. Peters, seconded by Coun. Wathen that Coun. Morton be appointed a member of such committee. Carried.

Ordered the \$1500 be paid Jude Finnigan and \$500 be paid John H. Robichaud, Road Commissioner, Richibucto, and charged to that parish.

Resolved that Warden appoint the wharf committee. The Warden appointed Couns. McKee, Wathen and Poirier as public wharf committee.

Moved by Coun. Atkinson, seconded by Coun. Daigle, that the said wharf committee have full power to repair the public wharf completely and in a workmanlike manner and report to the Council. Carried.

Moved by Coun. McKee, seconded by Coun. Atkinson that the Secretary from time to time under directions of said committee order necessary moneys to be paid by the Treasurer for repairing the public wharf. Carried.

Resolved that the Secretary be authorized to draw on the Treasurer for the amount necessary to repair the Court house and gaol.

Coun. McKee submits report of Finance Committee, showing amount voted, 421.04.

Resolved that the report of the Finance Committee be adopted and all amounts ordered therein to be paid, be paid.

Coun. Landry asks that the committee appointed to ascertain financial standing of county have until this afternoon to report.

Coun. Beers, from committee appointed to make financial arrangements with the bank, reports that the same arrangements as last year were completed with the manager of the bank.

Resolved that \$15.50 paid Treasurer by Edmond Cormier, collector of St. Marys, be paid to Road Commissioners, St. Marys, as follows: Marcell LeBlanc, No. 1, \$8.50; Alban Dionne, No. 2, \$2.00; Wesley Coates, No. 3, \$5.00.

Moved by Coun. Beers, seconded by Coun. Atkinson that the Secretary memorialize the local Government to enact a law that no peddler's license be granted to any non resident for less than a fee of \$200 annually in this county. Carried.

Resolved that W. E. Forbes be Treasurer for ensuing year at same salary as last year.

Resolved that W. D. Carter be auditor for ensuing year at a salary of \$50 a year.

Moved by Coun. Richard, seconded by Coun. McKee that the provisions in act of 1890 cap. 20 section 10 be adopted by this Council, that the list of delinquents be handed to collectors instead of Tax Book.

Coun. Landry, from committee appointed to ascertain financial standing of county, submits report showing cash in Treasurer's hands received between 6th and 11th instant, \$2938.89.

Cash on hand previous to the 6th, \$2112.13.

Expended between 6th and 11th January, \$886.42.

Leaving balance on hand 11th January, 1900, \$4464.60.

Debentures, \$160.00.

Finance Committee accounts, \$424.04.

Total debt balance, \$11956.44.

Resolved that said report be adopted.
