"FRERE CAMP, Jan. 8 .- Following has been received from Gen. White dated 2 p. m. yesterday (Sunday):-

"The attack commenced chiefly against 'Caesar's camp, and Wagon Hill. The enemy in great strength pushed his attack with the greatest courage. The entrenchments at Wagon Hill were three times retaken by us. The attack was continued until 7.30 p. m. At one point our position was occupied by the enemy the whole day but at dusk, during a heavy rain storm they were turned out at the point of the bayonet in the most gallant manner by the Devons, Col. Park leading. Col. Ian Hamilton commanding Wagon Hill, rendered valuable services. The troops had a most trying time but behaved excellent. I am elated over the services they have rendered to the Queen. The enemy was everywhere repulsed with heavy loss, greatly exceeding ours."

THE BOER REPULSE COST MANY BRITISH LIVES.

LONDON, Jan. 9th .- Further news of General White's victory is anxiously waited as it is generally realized to-day that there was little warrant for the exultation, which, perhaps, naturally followed the announcement of his repulse of the Boers when the country had braced itself to hear the worst.

GENERAL JOUBERT AGAIN SER-IOUSLY INJURED.

LONDON, Jan. 9.-Inquirers at the war office was informed that the list of British casualties at Ladysmith is not expected to-day and possibly not to-morrow. A despatch from Estcourt to the Glasgow Mail states positively that Joubert is seriowaly injured.
