many others, resisted the movement started by Mr. Foster, who seemed to forget the loyal aid rendered to his party by the late Premier, Hon. Mr. Mitchell, and other prominent members and supporters of the local government.

COMING DOMINION ELECTIONS.

"What attitude will your Government take in the next Dominion elections?" "I cannot speak for the Government, further than to say that there has so far been no change in our policy of non-intervention as a Government.

"Speaking, however, for myself personally, I feel that in the policy of the Government of extending the Intercolonial Railway to Montreal, in rushing to completion the canal system, which will enable the Intercolonial and its terminal ports of St. John and Halifax to reach out for the trade of the west, in the vast improvement which has been made in the management of the Intercolonial Railway by the present Minister of Railways and Canals, which is of vital importance to the section of the Province which I represent, the wise and statesmanlike attitude of the Government upon the transportation question, the determined efforts which the government has made and is making to direct Canadian trade through Canadian channels, in the patriotic and Imperial policy of granting in the markets of Canada a preference to British goods, the course of the government so entirely meets my approval that I shall adhere to the conclusion arrived at a considerable time ago, to give to Mr. Blair, as the representative of New Brunswick, in the Dominion Cabinet, and to his government, such assistance as I shall be able. Being in a position conscientiously to do this by reason of my hearty concurrence in the administration

of affairs by the present government, it will afford me not a little pleasure to return even though in small measure, the blows which were aimed at me and my colleagues in the recent Provincial contest. You may perhaps remember seeing an interview with Sir Charles Tupper, published, I think, in the Montreal Gazette, just before the last New Brunswick elections, in which that distinguished statesman did me the honor to refer to my refusal to obey the dictates of Mr. Foster and others, and desert my colleagues, with whom I had served loyally for many years, and said that if I did not do so, it would be all the worse for Tweedie.

"After an experience of twenty-six years in political life, and having only suffered one defeat, I might fairly claim to be able to judge something of the prospects, and I would unhesitatingly say that in my opinion the people of New Brunswick will, at the coming election, whenever it may take place, give to the Minister of Railways the largest following which any Minister from the Province has ever had."

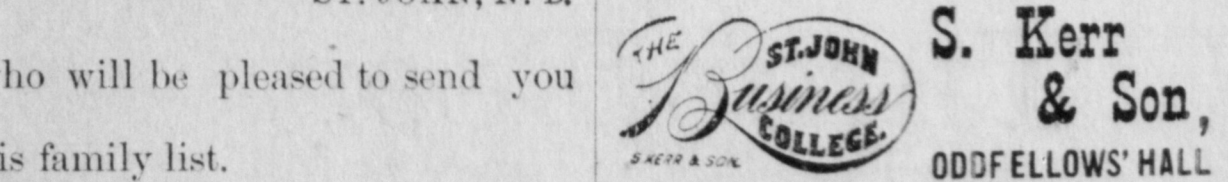
