The contract calls for weekly delivery and the goods must all be delivered before March 1st. The sale which usually would have been regarded as an ordinary one, is important only for the effect which it will have upon the market conditions. It indicates the confidence of Mr. Borden in the future of the trade and should have the effect of causing the buying movement to set in. This movement has been due for some time now, but has been held in abeyance in the hope that price concessions could be obtained.

We wish the Acadian Society every success in their new enterprise, and trust that the magazine may long continue to promote the interests of Acadia in particular, and Canada at large.




