Borden again came to the relief of local print cloth manufacturers by purchasing through the selling committee 150,000 regulars at the present price of 3 1/8 cents, thus breaking the almost unparalleled period of dullness and quiet through which manufacturers have been passing for the past four months. The contract calls for weekly delivery and the goods must all be delivered before March 1st. The sale which usually would have been regarded as an ordinary one, is important only for the effect which it will have upon the market conditions. It indicates the confidence of Mr. Borden in the future of the trade and should have the effect of causing the buying movement to set in. This movement has been due for some time now, but has been held in abeyance in the hope that price concessions could be obtained.

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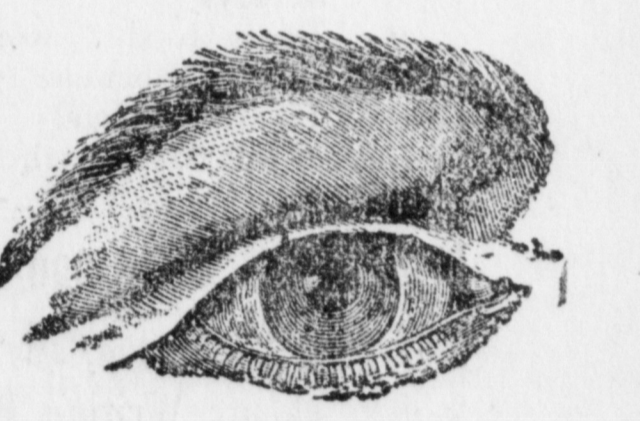
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
