LOCAL LEGISLATORS MEET.

WHAT THE "SPEECH FROM THE THRONE' CONTAINS-MR. ROBINSON, OF WEST-MORLAND, ELECTED SPEAKER.

FREDERICTON, Feb. 28 .- At noon today the members of the Legislature met at the parliament building and took the oath of allegiance to His Majesty before Judge Gregory and signed the roll. The absentees were Messrs, Purdy, Robertson and McLeod, St. John; McCain, Carleton; Glasier, Sunbury. Judge Gregory also swore in Mr. Rainsford, clerk of the House, and Assistant Clerk Dibblee, and Sergeant-at-Arms Rutter was then sworn

At 3 o'clock this afternoon the formal opening took place. The Lieutenant Governor was attended by Col. Dunbar, D. O. C., Lieut. Winslow, A. D. C., Major W. C. Good, Lieut. Col. McLearn and R. S. Barker. At the parliament building His Honor was received by a guard of honor from the Military School under Capt. Thacker, and as the party entered the building the detachment from the Newcastle Field Battery, under Major Maltby, fired a salute of fifteen guns.

The galleries were completely filled and a large number of spectators had seats on the floor of the assembly room, which was handsomely draped in black and purple. Clifford W. Robinson, M. P. P., for




