DOMINION NEWS.

OTTAWA, Jan. 25.—Colonel Otter will be the next quartermaster General, and once the position is given to a Canadian it will likely remain that way. The manner in which this will be brought about is to appoint Col. Foster, the present Quartermaster General, to the command of the Kingston Military College. It is understood this will be done. Col. Otter's place in Toronto will be filled by Col. Evans, who was in command of the Mounted Infantry. This will also open up a place for Major Williams, who would be placed in command of the Royal Dragoons at Winnipeg instead of Col. Evans. In regard to the change in D. O. C.'s there is still talk that Col. Peters will go to London and Col. Holmes to British Columbia. It is also said Col. Lesard will go to Quebec.

MIDDLE RIVER, C. B., Jan. 25.—It is interesting to note at this particular time that Middle River has a citizen who saw the light of three centuries, in the person of Mr. Angus Campbell. He was born in the year 1793, and is still in possession of all his faculties, being able to read and talk intelligently, and until very lately did considerable work about the farm.

LONDON, Ont., Jan. 25.—Sir John Carling is confined to his bed suffering from an attack of heart failure brought on by la grippe. He will recover but must have perfect rest and quiet.

MONTREAL, Jan. 26.—G. E. Starnes, brother of the late Hon. Henry Starnes, M. L. C., and an ex-Mayor of Montreal, shot himself at his home at Longueuil this morning. Deceased has been forty years in the employ of the City Hall and was seventy-two years old.

WINDSOR, Ont., Jan. 25.—Fire broke out in a match factory at Walkerville this evening. While firemen were putting it out an explosion occurred, killing Wm. Brindle and injuring several others, among whom is said to be Private Phillips, lately from South Africa.

MONTREAL, Jan. 25.—Between four and eight o'clock this morning fire completely destroyed the butter and cheese warehouse of D. A. Macpherson & Co., William street. The warehouses owned by W. A. Johnson and Nicholas Pitt which adjoined Macpherson's were also burned. These form part of the cold storage dairy houses but none of the others were damaged. Macpherson was one of the four firms which have a corner on cheese in sight in Canada, the others being Hodgson Bros., James Alexander and Ayer & Co. He is credited with carrying thirty thousand boxes, but most of this was in public cold storage warehouse. The loss cannot be much under \$50,000.
