OTTAWA, Nov. 14.—The annual report of the inland revenue department for the fiscal year ending June 30 last, was issued to-day. The revenue for the year was \$10,608,708, as compared with \$10,039,076 for the previous year.

Rev. A. J. Irwin, pastor of the Methodist church at Port Colborne, Ont., Mrs. Irwin and their son Arthur are in a serious condition caused by eating sardines.

The Bell Telephone Co., Ottawa, has decided to raise the rates by \$5 per year.

A cable to the Militia department, Ottawa, from South Africa, states that Trooper William Volans, whose mother lives in Portland, Oregon, was severely wounded November 4 at Witkomst.

J. W. Stewart of Winnipeg, has been awarded the contract by the Canadian Pacific Railway to lower the grades in the mountains at Fielden.

Wm. Robinson, ex-member of the Ontario Legislature, writes to the press that Principal Grant, of Queen's University, asked Andrew Carnegie for assistance for the college and received the assurance of a liberal donation if Principal Grant would advocate the annexation of Canada to the United States.
