THE WAR OFFICE HAS CABLED ACCEPT. ANCE OF THE OFFER.

ADDITIONAL CANADIAN SQUAD.

RONS.

OTTAWA, Dec. 15 .- The Dominion government has received a wire from the war office accepting their offer of two additional squadrons of Canadian mounted rifles. This will make a contingent of office bas asked that all the horses that the troopships will accommodate be sent. This will be done. The minister of militia has also cabled the war office asking if a field hospital of five medical men, 43 will be a couple of days likely before he will receive a reply.

The following order was given out to the press:

"In consequence of accommodation being available on the transport, two additional equadrons of mounted rifles will be raised for service in South Africa. Recruiting will be commenced as soon as practicable. The dates and the quotas to be raised at the different recruiting centres will be notified later."

Dr. Borden received a telegram from Dawson City to-day stating that four troopers had left to join the mounted rifles and asking to keep positions for them. Three were mounted policemen. The minister telegraphed that if they were here in time they would get positions. 
