A Sydney despatch says: The Chronicle's correspondent learns, though not from an official source, that plans are now being prepared which if carried out will materially decrease the distance by rail between Amherst and Sydney. According to the Chronicle's informant the I. C. R. authorities are considering the advisability of building a line straight across country from Amherst to Pugwash Juncton. The proposed line would be twenty five miles shorter than the present route from Amherst to Oxford Junction.

Then it is also proposed to divert the line from Scotsbarn, Pictou County, across the Middle River to the old Drummond line, thence along this line to New Glasgow. This would mean a one per cent. grade from Scotsburn to the East River and a level rail from the latter place into New Glasgow. This diversion would save a two and a half per cent. grade via Westville and Stellarton, and the line through these places would be used for local traffic only.

From New Glasgow the proposed route runs across country to the head of Merigomish harbor in order to get rid of a heavy grade. By the proposed route the distance between 'Amherst and Sydney would be about thirty three miles shorter than the present route and the saving in time would be great. It is understood that the matter will be brought up at the next session of the Dominion House.

A court circular of London last night announced that the journey which King Edward and Queen Alexandra were to make to Sand fingham where they were to spend Christmas, is postponed in consequence of the slight indisposition of Her Majesty. He thinks there are enough cases in Ottawa City now to make that place a source of real danger, which only stringent measures can guard against, and urges vaccination as the only preventive.






