TO QUEEN ALEXANDRA. THE ADDRESS FROM CANADIAN WOMEN. (The Ladies' Magazine, Toronto.) She seemed much impressed with the "trouble that had been taken" and begged the deputation over and over again to thank the women of Canada for this expression of their loyalty and affection.

ZOLGOSZ EXAMINED. PRONOUNCED SANE. PHYSICAL AND MENTAL TESTS ARE APPLIED TO PRESIDENT'S ASSASSIN. BUFFALO, Sept. 12.—Leon Czolgosz is not insane. This fact was established this afternoon by an examination made by two experts in the dungeon of the city prison.

DOMINION NEWS.

TORONTO, Sept. 11.—The American Steel and Wire Co., one of the units of the U. S. Steel Co., has decided to establish a working branch in Canada. It is not yet decided at what point the factory will be located but it is expected to be Toronto.

OTTAWA, Sept. 12.—Mr. W. G. Parmelee, Deputy Minister of Trade and Commerce, who returned from the Maritime Provinces, paid a visit while in Sydney, N. S., to the immense work of the Dominion Steel company. By the new regulation the supervision of output and payments of bounty on all the iron and steel produced in Canada devolves upon the Department of Trade and Commerce, and by all appearances it will be no light task.
