

MONTREAL, Nov. 30.—Lord Aylmer died at Richmond last night at an advanced age. He was the seventh baron of the line. He was the father of Hon Matthew Aylmer, Adjutant General of the Canadian forces. He was failing in health for about a year past and as he was unable to go and see them, the Prince and Princess of Wales on their tour through Canada did him the honor of stopping at Richmond to see his Lordship.

The Right Hon. Sir Udolphus Aylmer, Baron of Balrath, Lord, is the second son

of the late Capt. John Athamer Aylmer R. N. by his wife Elizabeth, daughter of Hy. Contes, and was born June 10, 1814. He accompanied his father to Canada during the governorship of the fifth Lord Aylmer, who was a general in the army he served in the Canada militia during the Rebellion of 1837. Later, he became Lt.-Col. of the 54th, "Richmond" Batt. V. M., from which he retired retaining rank, August 1894. He was one of the founders of St Francis College, Richmond, P. Q., and held for a considerable period, the office of President, of that

corporation. He succeeded to the title of 7th Baron of Balrath and Lord Aylmer in 1858. His Lordship was married in 1841 to Mary Eliza (who died in 1881), daughter of Edward Journeaux, J. P., formerly of Dublin, Ireland. Politically a Liberal; in religion he is an Anglican. "A public spirited citizen, and one who has always taken a deep interest in the progress of agriculture."—Montreal Herald.
