



When the liver is clogged by the inactivity of the kidneys and bowels, it becomes torpid and fails to filter the bile from the blood, thus producing biliousness and a general impairment of the digestive system.

FLOWER AND TREE.

Heavy pruning of growing trees will check growth.

Flowering plants should never be watered with cold water. It chills the plants.

The Madeira vine is one of the best climbers, having a wreath of leaves equaled by few other plants.

Repotting of plants becomes necessary at intervals for two reasons. The plant uses up the available fertility in the soil and fills the pots with roots. The ink plant of New Granada is a

curiosity. The juice of it can be used as ink without any preparation. At first the writing is red, but after a few hours it changes to black.

In watering the primrose observe this: Water should not be poured upon the crown of the plant nor the pot filled so full that the water flows over into it. This is fatal to the health of the plant.

To destroy aphides or plant lice dip the ends of the twigs into a strong tea water or syringe with whale oil soapsuds, repeating the operation in six or seven days.


