The Windsor Hotel, Montreal, is to have four more storeys, which will give 100 rooms added accommodation, and will cost about \$100,000.

In the Recorder's Court in Montreal, William Cartwright was fined \$50 for conducting a lottery in connection with the Cyclorama of Jerusalem.

The Dominion Government is contributing \$9,000 towards the cost of Montrose bridge over the Chippewa River.

Sheriff Dawson is suing the County of Frontenac, Ont., for a stationery bill of \$68 that the Audit Committee refused to pass.

During the past quarter the cost of maintenance for prisoners at the County Jail, London, Ont., averaged 5 2-5 cents each per diem, a decrease of 1-10 cents on the previous quarter.
