FATAL ACCIDENT.

CHARLES HOWARD KILLED AT SAND POINT TO-DAY.

(St. John Globe, Jan. 17.)

The deep water terminus at Sand Point was the scene of another fatal accident today. Charles Howard was killed by being precipitated from the staging of No. 4 warehouse to the hold of the S. S. Manchester Trader.

Howard, who lived on Rockland Road with his wife and four small children, left his home this morning to work on the steamer, on which members of the Ship Laborers' Society were hired to discharge the cargo. About 9.35 o'clock Howard and "Abe" Watters were receiving rolls of oilcloth as they were hoisted from the hold on a sling to an elevated staging. They were placing the rolls sideways on a truck, there being three of the heavy rolls ropes the man in charge of the steam winch, thinkin; all was clear, started his engine, and the sling, lifted clear of the truck, swept both men off the narrow staging, as it swung with its heavy bur den towards the steamer. Watters and Howard instantly grasped the ropes of the sling and clung to them as they were swept off into space. Watters managed to get a firm hold and was able to hold on until the descending sling lowered to the deck, but Howard lost his hold almost immediately and was precipitated into the yawning hatchway. He fell to the bottom platform and struck head first on a deal. He was picked up unconscious, and telephone messages were sent for physicians. The doctors of the Lake Superior and the Pretorian arrived, but could do nothing and in a few minutes the poor fellow breathed his last. Dr. Day arrived soon after, but the man was then pronounced dead. The police were notified and Coroner Kenny was summoned. After viewing the body he ordered the remains removed to the west side morgue, and instructed Sergeant Ross to empanel

The sad accident caused a cessation of work on the steamer. There was general regret, for Howard was well known and popular with his fellow laborers.

The Globe reporter was informed that the staging and the hoisting gear were perfectly secure. The accident was caused through the starting of the winch before the men bad got the sling unloaded. The man in charge thought he heard the order given to go ahead.

Howard was well known in the North End and was once famous as a runner. He has worked at times for Messrs. Price & Shaw and for Tapley Bros. and Stetson,

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
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
